

All: Let us sing praises to our Divine Source of Life and Love!



TEATIME FOR PEACE At BUCC - This Wednesday, September 12th, the Southern Hills Interfaith Association and CAIR [Council on America-Islamic Relations] Ohio will be hosting an event called *Teatime for Peace*. This will be an opportunity to deepen the understanding and relationship between our Muslim neighbors and ourselves, through guided conversations over tea and treats. This gathering offers an excellent opportunity for people of diverse communities to get to know one another, and to recognize and celebrate our shared humanity and common aspirations. The event will be held in Pilgrim Hall, as part of this year's Welcome & Growth emphasis. Registration/Sign-in begins at 6:30 pm, with the program starting at 7:00.

BRECKSVILLE UCC MUSIC MINISTRY - Autumn rehearsals for our music ensembles at BUCC have begun. Here is the schedule of days and times:

Joyful Noise Choir (K through 5th grade): Thursdays from 5:30 to 6:15. Fun songs are learned about living Jesus' message of love and respect for others. Singing usually followed by activities, including drawing, games, playground, etc.

Adult Choir (high school students welcome): Thursdays from **7:00 to 8:30**. **Note new starting time.** Adult choir is a good way to prepare spiritually for Sunday services, and provides an enjoyable opportunity for choral singing and fellowship in a relaxed, affirming environment.

Youth Percussion Group (6th grade and up): First practice is tonight Sept. 9 from 5:30-6:00 before youth ministry at 6. Players learn rhythm patterns to accompany music at services, including preludes, offertories, communion and postludes, as well as occasional choir anthems. An ancient form of music-making, playing percussion can help relieve stress while being a gateway to meditation.

Recorder/Dulcimer/Guitar Ensemble (all ages welcome): First practice will be Wed. Sept. 12 from 4:30-5:00. This group plays prelude music for services about once a month. Listening CDs are provided to help with the learning process. Sheet music features both musical notes and musical letters.

Seasonal Choir (high school students welcome): Seasonal choir members fill out the regular choir in presenting BUCC's annual Christmas cantata. Cantata rehearsals will begin on Thurs. Oct. 11 from 7-8:00 PM.

Instrumentalists (all ages welcome): If you play a musical instrument and would be comfortable playing a piece for the congregation (or accompanying choir for an anthem), let Dave D. know so he can keep you in mind during scheduling process.

Private piano lessons (all ages welcome): If you studied with Dave last spring, he will be in touch about this year's schedule. If you would like to start taking lessons, contact him to schedule. Lessons start up this week on Sept. 12 and 13; they are usually scheduled for Wed. and Thursdays.

As we begin our new church season, give some prayerful thought to participating in BUCC's music program. Martin Luther wrote, "Beautiful music is the art of the prophets that can calm the agitations of the soul; it is one of the most magnificent and delightful presents God has given us." Consider becoming part of the gifting process - check out a rehearsal or two this fall. All are welcome!

Readings

The Old Testament - Jeremiah 31:31-34

The days are surely coming, says the Holy One, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt - a covenant that they broke, though I was their devoted partner. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Holy One: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Holy One," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

The New Testament - Luke 6:40-42; 46-49

Jesus says: A student is not above the teacher, but everyone who is fully prepared will be like the teacher. Why do you see the speck in your neighbor's eye, but do not notice the log in your own eye? Or how can you say to your neighbor, "Friend, let me take out the speck in your eye," when you yourself do not see the log in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your neighbor's eye....

Why do you call me Lord, and do not do what I tell you? I will show you what someone is like who comes to me, hears my words, and acts on them. That one is like a person building a house, who dug deeply and laid the foundation on rock; when a flood arose, the river burst against that house but could not shake it, because it had been well built. But the one who hears, and does not act is like a person who built a house on the ground without a foundation. When the river burst against it, immediately it fell, and great was the ruin of that house.

The Continuing Testament - by David Ewart - in *Holy Textures* [edited]

What is the crucial difference between one who is wise and one who is foolish? It has nothing to do with what we usually associate with wisdom: knowledge, many years of experience, perspective, intelligence, insight, etc... Nor does it have to do with *hearing* what Jesus has to say. The difference between being either wise or foolish, is in *acting* or *not* acting.

It is not enough for us to hear these words of Jesus; to study them; to be inspired by them; to have hopes and aspirations, dreams and plans based on them. We must *act* on them; practice them, and live them in our everyday lives.
