Readings

The Old Testament - Genesis 2.18-24

Then the Holy One said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper suitable for him." So out of the ground the Holy One formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name. The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the man there was not found a suitable helper.

So the Holy One caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and as he slept; the Holy One took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. And the rib that had been taken from the man, the holy One made into a woman, and brought her to the man. Then the man said, "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called Woman, for out of Man she was taken." Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and clings to his wife, and they become one flesh.

The New Testament - Mark 10:2-16

Some Pharisees came, and to test Jesus they asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?" He answered them, "What did Moses command you?" They said, "Moses allowed a man to write a certificate of dismissal and to divorce her." But Jesus said to them, "Because of your hardness of heart he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation, 'The Holy One made them male and female.' 'For this reason, a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.' So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore, what the Holy One has joined together, let no one tear apart."

Then in the house the disciples asked him again about this matter. He said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery." People were bringing little children to him in order that he might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the Divine Realm belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the Divine Realm like a little child will never enter it." And he took the children up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.

The Continuing Testament - from *More than Harassment* - by Sandra Sorensen [edited]

As people of faith who profess to believe in the full personhood of women, affirming that they are created in the Divine image, we need to break the silence around policies and practices that allow women to be treated unequally. We would do well to think about the work we still have to do to bring about justice for women. Consider for instance the gap in pay equity, which grows significantly larger when we look at the disparity in pay for women of color.

Or consider the lack of affordable childcare and family-friendly workplace polices like paid sick leave and family leave, which disproportionately affect women as primary caregivers. Consider the failure of Congress to close the loopholes that continue to allow domestic abusers access to guns. Or the fact that the current Administration has yet to appoint anyone as head of the Department of Justice's Office of Violence Against Women. Funding for programs under the Violence Against Women Act is vulnerable to budget cuts.

These are actions, or inactions, that speak volumes - far beyond the well-rehearsed sound-bites and press statements of Politicians. The real work must take us deeper into addressing the policies and institutional structures that provides tacit assent for harassment and create environments that allow for abusive behavior against women. We must remain diligent in our efforts to affirm the Divine dignity of all people, especially those who society treats as less valuable or unworthy.
