

Readings

The Old Testament - Isaiah 53:4-12

Surely the Righteous One has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Holy One has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth. By a distortion of justice he was taken away. Who could have imagined his future? For he was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people. They made his grave with the wicked and his tomb with the rich, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth.

Yet it was the will of the Holy One that he should bear such affliction. By giving his life as an offering for sin, he shall see his offspring, and shall prolong his days; through him the will of the Holy One shall prosper. Out of his anguish he shall see light; he shall find satisfaction through his experience. The righteous one, my servant, shall make many righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities. Therefore I will allot him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he poured out himself to death, and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

The New Testament - Mark 10:35-45

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to Jesus and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." He said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you?" They said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, when you enter your glory." But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. ▶

Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" They replied, "We are able." Then Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared."

When the other ten disciples heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, "You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you. Whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be the servant of all. For the Human One came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many."

The Continuing Testament - from *Downward Mobility* - by Alan Brehm [edited]

In Jesus' day, it's the aristocratic land barons and their religious cronies who make the rules; and of course, they make the rules to benefit themselves. These days it seems to be the corporate barons and their political cronies who are guilty of that kind of blatant self-interest. But Jesus says that approach won't work. He says that the way it should be is for the "greatest" to be a servant, and for the "first" to be the servant of all. While he is talking about the Christian community, I think he's also talking about what it means to thrive in human society.

When the "great" among us only seek to benefit and further enrich themselves at the expense of others, it leads to the disintegration of society - something like what we see going on around us today. It fuels a growing dissatisfaction. When we *all* begin to live like that - feeling discontented with what we have and thinking the only way for us to be happy is to get a bigger slice of the pie - it becomes a recipe for hostility, frustration and anger toward those around us. But Jesus says that the way to life is found elsewhere. It's found by giving ourselves away as he did.

When the "great" sacrifice themselves for the sake of all, then we see society as a whole begin to thrive. We see real justice, peace, and harmony in our world. You may say I'm a dreamer, but as John Lennon put it, I'm not the only one. Most of my favorite theologians and spiritual writers have the same dream. It's a dream of a world in which we all follow Jesus' example of self-giving, instead of constantly wanting more and more. Maybe it's time we try to recover the kind of "downward mobility" Jesus talks about - a way of life that seeks not to take but to give, that seeks not to be served but to serve. A way of life that leads to true living!
