

BUCC ANNOUNCEMENTS

WE WELCOME all our guests who are worshiping with us today. Please sign our guest book and join us downstairs in Pilgrim Hall for our Coffee Hour.

WE WELCOME VISITING PARENTS - We offer several child care options and fun activities for kids during worship hour: Infants and toddlers will be cared for in the nursery. Kindergarten through seventh grade will go to class after the Word to Young Worshipers. Crayons and paper are also available from ushers for children.

FOR OUR COMMUNION SERVICE, grape juice is used instead of wine for the purpose of showing solidarity with those among us who may be in recovery from addiction.

TODAY, we are serving a hunger meal at Pearl Road United Methodist Church in partnership with Independence United Methodist Church. The menu is the usual mostaccioli, salad, and cookies. BUCC will provide the entrée, milk, bread and spread, and a few cookies. Our partner will provide the salad and dressing and more cookies. The sign-up board is in the narthex for interested persons to indicate their willingness to help. The first shift is from 2:30 PM to 4:00 PM to set up and prepare. The second shift will be from 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM to serve and clean up.

MITTEN TREE the Mitten Tree is back in the narthex ready for your decorations of mittens, gloves, hats, scarves, socks, etc. These items will be sent to hunger centers for distribution.

NORTHEAST OHIO ROCKS! is a Facebook group with more than 200,000 members that began in 2016 with the intent of spreading kindness one rock at a time. Members paint rocks with positive and uplifting messages and hide them where children and adults will find them and experience a random act of kindness. The back of the rock has a message requesting the finder to post a photo on Facebook and then re-hide it to pass on the kindness. If the rock painter has added a hashtag the finder adds this to the Facebook post and the person who hid it can track its whereabouts. Some rocks are tracked over several months and across the country when finders carry them to distant places. Northeast Ohio Rocks are appearing in all 50 states and in 100 foreign lands. You don't have to post on Facebook, but you are asked to hide #BUCCrocks and keep spreading the kindness!

THE BUCC PASTOR'S FUND is primarily used for food gift cards, help with rent or utilities, uncovered medical/medication bills, or emergency aid to travelers passing through town. We are asking that those who can, consider making a contribution to help replenish this fund. Checks can be made out to BUCC, or cash may be placed in a pew envelope, with the notation "Pastor's Fund" written on the check or envelope. Thank you for your continuing support!

DID YOU MISS last Sunday's service or do you just want to have a chance to rehear Pastor Dave's sermon. The Sunday services are recorded in their entirety on audio CDs each week. OUR COMPLETE WORSHIP SERVICE, including anthems, hymns, etc., is fed by our sound system to our new audio-CD recorder (CDs are available in the church office for borrowing) and to the narthex speakers (for the benefit of anyone who must leave the sanctuary because of a restless child or for any other reason). If you should use one of the portable microphones during the service, please do not turn it off but return it to its location so that its continuing feed is not eliminated from the system.

POINSETTIA DEDICATIONS Starting in the December, 2018 Pillar there will be an order form, and also starting in the 11/25 Bulletin there will be an order form to make a Poinsettia Dedication.

THE PEACE CANDLE is placed up front every Sunday to remind us of Jesus' teachings on peace and peacemakers. We pray that peace between nations, within our country, community, families, and ourselves will become a priority for all.

Readings

The Old Testament - Leviticus 19:9-15; 33-34

When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap to the very edges of your field, or gather the gleanings of your harvest. You shall not strip your vineyard bare, or gather the fallen grapes of your vineyard; you shall leave them for the poor and the alien: I am the Holy One, your God.

You shall not steal; you shall not deal falsely; and you shall not lie to one another. And you shall not swear falsely by my name, profaning the name of your God: I am the Holy One. You shall not defraud your neighbor; you shall not steal; and you shall not keep for yourself the wages of a laborer until morning. You shall not revile the deaf or put a stumbling block before the blind; you shall reverence your God: I am the Holy One.

You shall not render an unjust judgment; you shall not be unfair to the poor or defer to the great: with justice you shall treat your neighbor....When an alien resides with you in your land, you shall not oppress the alien. The alien who resides with you shall be to you as the citizen among you; you shall love the alien as yourself, for you yourselves were aliens in the land of Egypt: I am the Holy One your God.

The New Testament - Luke 6:31-38

"But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. Do to others as you would have them do to you. "If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. If you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. If you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to receive as much again. But love your enemies, do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return. Your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High; for he is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

"Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven; give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back."

The Continuing Testament - a Still-speaking God - from the UCC website [edited]

If you think God's not finished with you yet, guess what? God's not even finished with God yet! God isn't finished with you, or finished with the Church or our world, or even letting us know more about God's own compassion, justice, hope, and truth. If you are open, if you listen carefully, you'll discover what God is saying to this generation at this time in history. There's more Good News to be heard!

Today, God is especially speaking through a beautiful diversity of voices. God continues to form us through a multi-cultural mosaic that reflects all of creation. We also hear God's voice in public policy that advocates for those who are poor, hungry, or most vulnerable in our society. Consider, for example, how God speaks-out for justice on behalf of immigrant children who remain separated from their parents, or for transgender people whose self-identity is being mocked and threatened by unenlightened politicians.

As God's inclusive family, we seek to celebrate our common ground, while honoring our differences. As Christ's Body, the Church, we prayerfully seek together to discern God's voice in the midst of many voices. We are aware, at the same time, that God's voice may come in a lone voice, crying-out in a world that does not listen. And even without words at all, we know that God still comes to us, often as we wait in the silence.
