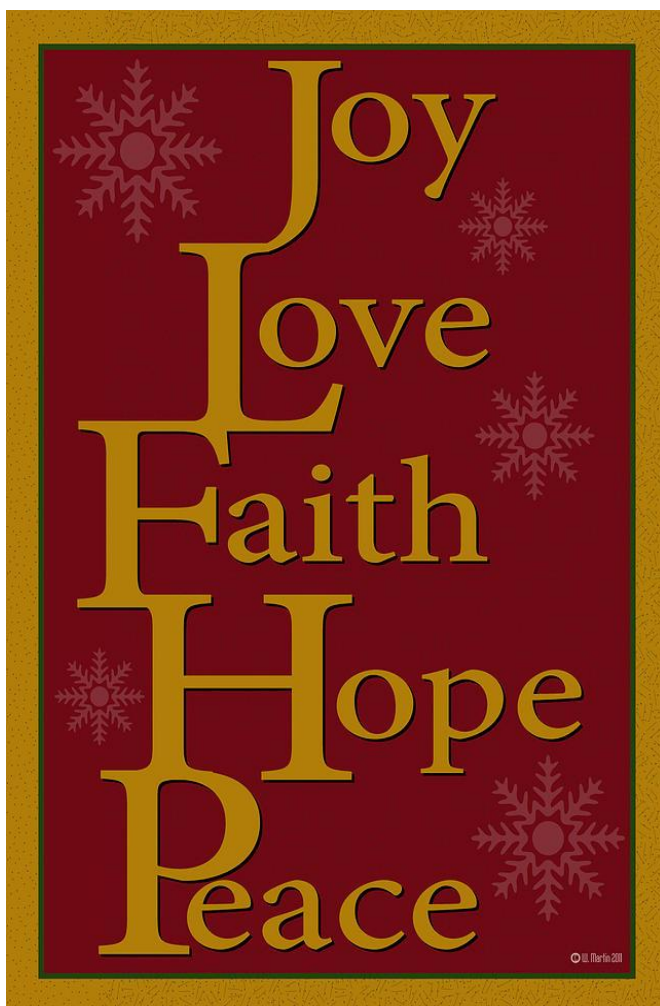


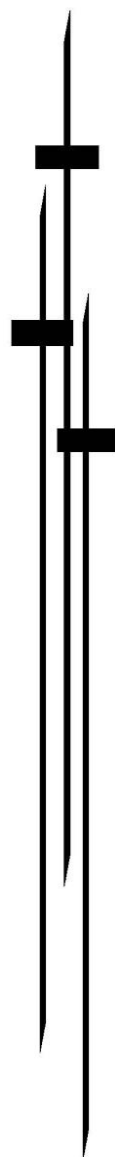

Pastor's Ponderings

...on the Advantages of Keeping Advent...?

December 2nd marks the start of Advent, the beginning of a new Church Year. Advent is a time of hoping, waiting, and joyful anticipation, as we prepare to celebrate anew the birth of Jesus Christ. In a society that tends to worship speed and instant gratification, the Church's call to patiently wait and watch can seem a bit strange. And in these fast-paced days of hectic holiday overload, the Church's message to slow-down and keep things simple, seems simply unrealistic. One good way for you and me to stay centered in this culturally-chaotic season, is to remember what [or Who] it is for which we are waiting and watching: God's Living, Loving Presence among us.

With the birth of Jesus Christ, the Holy One touches the world in a simple, yet spectacular way - reminding us that there is no place or time on earth that is beyond God's care and influence. Advent helps us to be patient, and to recognize the Holy Presence even among the haste and hassle of this busy time of year. It reminds us that the Holy One meets us wherever we go, even in those places and people we might least expect. In the stores, on the streets, throughout our communities, there are multitudes of people who you and I can meet and greet with Christ' calming peace. FINANCE



During the month of October, a check was sent to the Western Reserve Association in the amount of \$5,683.50. The Neighbors in Need collection was \$1,046, and the third quarter OCWM contribution was \$4,637.50.

NEWS FROM OCWM

By the time you read this, there should be two small Christmas trees in the narthex. One is to be used as the “mitten tree”, on which are placed hats, mitten, and scarves supplied by BUCC members and friends. When the tree is full of these “decorations”, the items are removed and sent to local hunger centers when people receive their food items from the food pantry. This amazing tree will fill up with “decorations” numerous times over the cold weather months.



The other tree will be used for students in the Prentiss Autism Center of the Positive Education program located in Fairview Park. ►

All of these students have significant cognitive problems and severe behavior problems, as well as a diagnosis of autism. Currently 97 students from 32 different school districts in Northeast Ohio are being served. The tree will be “decorated” with tags indicating a students size and item needed or desired. This tree will appear right after Thanksgiving. BUCC members and friends are asked to select a “decoration” and return the desired item by the middle of December.

The Christmas offering will be received on Christmas Eve, Monday, December 24, 2018 at the late service. The proceeds will be used to provide gifts and pension supplementation for clergy and lay workers in all stages of their lives and ministries. Also included are health care premium supplementation and emergency grants. These funds are critical for a sustainable quality of life for these “veterans of the cross”.

A big “thank you” goes to all those who participated in last month’s hunger meal. The next hunger meal will be on January 6, 2019 at Iglesia Emmanuel.

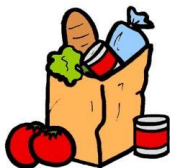
NOTES AND ASIDES
