The Readings

The Old Testament - Psalm 36:5-10

Your steadfast love, O Holy One, extends to the heavens, your faithfulness to the clouds. Your righteousness is like the mighty mountains, your judgments are like the great deep; you save humans and animals alike, gracious Creator. How precious is your steadfast love! All people may take refuge in the shadow of your wings. They feast on the abundance of your house, and you give them drink from the river of your delights. For with you is the fountain of Life; in your light we see light. O continue your steadfast love to those who know you, and your salvation to the upright of heart!

The New Testament - John 2:1-11

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, Jesus' mother said to him, "They have no wine." Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So, they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now."

Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

The Continuing Testament - from Words of Martin Luther King, Jr [edited]

The belief that God will do everything for us is as untenable as the belief that we can do everything for ourselves. They are both based on a lack of *faith*. We must learn that to expect God to do everything while we do nothing is not faith, but superstition. A religion true to its nature must also be concerned about people's social conditions. Religion deals with both heaven and earth, both time and eternity. Religion operates not only on the vertical plane, but also on the horizontal. It seeks not only to integrate people with God, but also to integrate people with people, and to help all people to be self-integrated within.

This means that the Christian Gospel is a two-way road. On the one hand, it seeks to change people's souls and thereby unite them with God; on the other hand, it seeks to change people's environmental conditions, so that the soul will have a chance after it is changed. Any religion that professes to be concerned with people's souls and is not concerned with the slums that damn them, the economic conditions that strangle them, and the social conditions that cripple them, is a dry-as-dust religion. Such a religion, as Marx might say, is merely an opiate of the people.
