





The Readings

The Old Testament - Psalm 19:1-4; 7-11

The heavens declare the glory of the Holy One; and the firmament proclaims the Creator's handiwork. Each day announces it to the following day; each night repeats it to the next. No speech or words are used, no sound is heard; yet their message goes out to all the world and is heard to the ends of the earth.... The Divine Law is perfect; reviving the soul. The commands of the Holy One are trustworthy, making wise the simple; the Heavenly Precepts are right, rejoicing the heart; the commandment of God is clear, enlightening the eyes; Reverence for God is good; enduring forever; the Divine Ordinances are true and righteous altogether. More to be desired are they then gold, even much fine gold; sweeter also than honey, and drippings of the honeycomb. They give knowledge to me, your servant; in keeping them there is great reward.

The New Testament - 1 Corinthians 12:12-18; 27

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body - Jews or Greeks, slaves or free - and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many.

If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear would say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as God chose.... Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.

The Continuing Testament - from *Universal Love* - by Bryan Findlayson [edited]

The Gospel expresses a depth of love that is more radical and more inclusive than the fragile relationships we mere mortals are able to create.

In matters of faith, we are always called to struggle for a depth of love and acceptance that reflects the amazing inclusivity of Divine love. How much more might God be able to do with us, if we were ready to transcend the boundaries of community and the limits of love that we ourselves have erected? It is never too late to respond to God's call to love beyond our self-imposed limits.

God has often reached beyond the confines of people's hardened hearts and is willing to do the same today. The Gospel proclaims God's universal love and reminds us - that as God's compassion and grace reaches beyond the social confines of institutional religion - so should ours. The doors of our church, and of our lives, should always be wide open to the world.
