


Pastor's Ponderings

...on an Extended Epiphany....

The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness cannot overcome it.
~ John 1:5

January 6th marked the beginning of the Epiphany Season, which continues until Ash Wednesday when Lent begins. This often happens by early or mid-February; but this year we have an extended Epiphany, with Ash Wednesday falling on March 6th. To me it seems somewhat fitting that this year we linger a bit longer in the Epiphany Season.

Epiphany is when the Church celebrates the Light of Christ being revealed to the entire world - signaled by the visit of the Magi from the East. The Magi were a group of astronomer/astrologers who searched for the meaning of Life beyond the earthbound. By raising their sights to the heavens, they sought to better understand the Creative Source of Life on earth. And while their story in *Matthew* reveals little about them, it does provide us a guiding star [as it were] to help on our own journey of faith and enlightenment.

One truly important step in the journey toward enlightenment, is the willingness to be open to *all* people. Because if you and I only engage with those who are like us - those with whom we feel comfortable or close - then we will miss-out on discovering the sacred component of the strangers we encounter. Imagine if Joseph had closed the door on those Magi, because of their odd clothes, their foreign accents, or their political or religious differences. Little Baby Jesus would have missed-out on some pretty awesome Christmas gifts.

One great gift any community of faith has to offer, is to extend a warm welcome to *any* stranger who comes among them. After all, we are all "strangers" to a certain degree [granted, some of us *stranger* than others], but that's a good thing! Because it challenges us to expand our thinking, to value our diversity, and to treasure the sacred uniqueness of one another and of ourselves. Every person you or I meet has something to offer; and often it's in our interacting with others, that our own Epiphany begins to break-forth. ►

So in the midst of the dark desire to build walls to exclude and separate, demonize and demoralize the “other” I’m glad that the Light of the Epiphany Season continues to shine long and brightly among us and within us!

FACILITIES



At the January Facilities Ministry meeting a list of potential items was developed for action by the Ministry for the 2019 fiscal year. The list will be prioritized by determining the need, the expense and the time involved.

- Power-wash Front of Education Building
- Repair concrete steps in front of Church entrance
- Fix the lighting on Pilgrim Hall or install new fixtures
- Document existing paint (cans) to church areas, discarding old paint
- Organize and document office telephone wiring
- Document existing sound system with assistance from Max Roha & David Pastor
- Request council approval for fund raising for new sanctuary roof

- Scrape & paint exterior building drain pipes
- Clean narthex light fixtures and glass panels
- Automate all front door exterior light
- Investigate paper recycle bin
- Repair loose handle on front double doors
- Consult with Christian Ed about decluttering 2nd floor CE rooms
- Paint rear double doors
- Paint exterior hand railings
- Replace Common Area chairs
- Automate all HVAC vents in church ceiling
- Remove old organ in Pilgrim Hall
- Replace old driveway signs (children at play & not thru driveways)
- Repave parking lot

NEWS FROM OCWM

The last hunger meal was served on Sunday, January 6th at Iglesia Emmanuel. Based on recent experience, about 20 or 30 people were expected. So 40 meals were prepared. However, about 50 or so people came, including children. We think this was a result of the country being shut down. If this is so, more careful preparation of meals is in order. Also, one or two extra servers might be needed.

Neighbors In Need – October 6


Christmas – December 24




Did you know that the 2002 addition of the south entry and accessible elevator required many years of planning and activity? Appointed by Lenore Harris, then Moderator, one of the first jobs of the Land-Use Task Force was the 1989 acquisition of the Elsworth property on Arlington St. ►

This assured our accessibility of adequate parking area. With the retention of Myers Architects, several alternate plans for remodeling and/or adding to our building and siting an elevator were studied and evaluated. However, it required the acquisition of the Dixon property in 1994 to make the project viable with enough land available both for the addition and for the automobile access from both Arlington Street and Route 82. Finalizing plans, securing permits, successful fund raising, and the negotiating of construction contracts lead to the breaking of ground of our "Opening Doors" project in 2002.
