

The Readings

The Old Testament - Psalm 91:1-2; 9-16

You who live in the shelter of the Most High, who abide in the shadow of the Almighty, will say to the Holy One "My refuge and my fortress; my God, in whom I trust...."

Because you have made the Holy One your refuge, the Most High your dwelling place, no evil shall befall you, no scourge come near your tent. For God will command the angels concerning you, to guard you in all your ways. On their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone. You will tread on the lion and the adder, the young lion and the serpent you will trample under foot. Those who love me, I will deliver; I will protect those who know my name. When they call to me, I will answer them; I will be with them in trouble, I will rescue them and honor them. With long life I will satisfy them, and show them my salvation.

The New Testament - Luke 4:1-13

Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan river and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing at all during those days, and when they were over, he was famished. The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become a loaf of bread." Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone." Then the devil led him up and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. And the devil said to him, "To you I will give their glory and all this authority; for it has been given over to me, and I give it to anyone I please. If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours." Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'You shall only worship and serve the Holy One, your God."

Then the devil took him to Jerusalem, and placed him on the pinnacle of the temple, saying to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written, God will command the angels concerning you, to protect you,' and 'On their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone." Jesus answered him, "It is said, 'Do not put the Holy One, your God, to the test." When the devil had finished every test, he departed from him until an opportune time.

The Continuing Testament - from *Sarah Laughed* - by Sarah Dylan Breuer [edited]

In the story of Satan tempting Jesus, we hear the devil using Scripture with relative ease. "For it is written ..." Satan says. Seeing Scripture used as a means of *temptation*, can offer a strong argument against the ways we are sometimes tempted to use Scripture. One of those ways, is what I call the "Magic 8-Ball" method. In the 8-Ball method of interpreting Scripture, we come to the Bible with a question. We then pick up the Bible and open it to some random portion, as we might shake the Magic 8-Ball, reading whatever biblical passage comes up as being somehow related to the question. Or, we can be tempted to selectively pick words, phrases, and sentences from the Bible, and read the resulting combination as a kind of secret message to us.

Neither of these methods of using Scripture is particularly helpful; they tell us more about our own psychology and interpretive prejudices than they do about the Holy One's will. Scripture's inspiration and usefulness doesn't make it a magical book, - an oracle that has the answer to any question we might want to ask. Even true statements that would be helpful in one context could be destructive if applied elsewhere. I am thankful that Jesus doesn't simply believe that every word of Scripture is equally applicable in every circumstance. He does not accept just any word from Scripture as being God's word to him at that moment. For Jesus, it's not just about Divine Truth; it's also about Divine Timing, and most of all about Divine Love
