

The Readings

The Old Testament - Psalm 27:1-5; 11-14

The Holy One is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Holy One is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid? When evildoers assail me to devour my flesh, my adversaries and foes, they shall stumble and fall. Though an army encamp against me, my heart shall not fear; though hostilities rise up against me, I will still be confident. One thing I ask of the Holy One, one thing will I seek: to live in God's house all the days of my life - to behold Divine beauty and truth within God's temple. For the Holy One will shelter me in the day of trouble; the Holy One will conceal me within God's dwelling and will keep me secure....

Teach me your way, O Gracious One, and lead me on a straight path, that I may walk safely past my enemies. Do not give me up to the will of my adversaries, for false witnesses have risen against me, and they are breathing out threats of violence. Yet I trust that I shall see the glory of the Holy One in the land of the living. Let all people look to the Holy One and be strong! Let your hearts take courage, as you wait for the Righteous One's deliverance!

The New Testament - Luke 13:31-35

At that very hour some Pharisees came and said to Jesus, "Get away from here, for Herod wants to kill you." He said to them, "Go and tell that fox for me, 'Listen, I am casting out demons and performing cures today and tomorrow, and on the third day I finish my work. Yet today, tomorrow, and the next day I must be on my way, because it is impossible for a prophet to be killed outside of Jerusalem.' Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! See, your house is left to you. And I tell you, you will not see me until the time comes when you say, 'Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Holy One.'"

The Continuing Testament - by Barbara Brown Taylor - in *The Christian Century* [edited]

Given the number of animals available, it is curious that Jesus chooses to compare himself with a hen. What about the mighty eagle of Exodus, or Hosea's stealthy leopard? What about the proud lion of Judah, mowing down his enemies with a roar? Compared to any of those, a mother hen does not inspire much confidence.

But a hen is what Jesus chooses, which - if you think about it - is pretty typical of him. He is always turning things upside down, so that children and peasants wind up on top, while kings and clerics land on the bottom. He is always wrecking our expectations of how things should turn out by giving prizes to losers and paying the last first. So of course, he chooses a hen, which is about as far from a fox as you can get.

Jesus won't be king of the jungle in this or any other story. What he will be is a mother hen, who stands between the chicks and those who mean to do them harm. She has no fangs, no claws, no rippling muscles. All she has is her willingness to shield her young with her own body. If the fox wants them, he will have to kill her first. Which, as it turns out, he does.
