COMMUNITY EDUCATION DINNER SERIES: On Tuesday, April 30th from 6:00 - 8:00 pm Christian Education and OCWM welcome you and our neighbors to join us for a FREE community dinner and a presentation by Camille R. Gill, Associate Director of Immigration Legal Services in the Migration and Refugee Services department of Catholic Charities. She will present "Immigration 101: Defining Terms and Discussing Current Issues." All are welcome! Childcare will be provided on-site. The Readings

The Old Testament - Isaiah 25:1; 4-8

O Holy One, you are my God; I will exalt you, I will praise your name; for you have done wonderful things, plans formed of old, faithful and sure.... You have been a refuge to the poor, a refuge to the needy in their distress, a shelter from the rainstorm and a shade from the heat. When the blast of the ruthless was like a winter rainstorm, the cries of the oppressed aliens like heat in a dry place, you subdued the heat with the shade of clouds; the song of the ruthless was stilled.

On this mountain the Holy One will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines, of rich food filled with marrow, of well-aged wines strained clear. And God will destroy on this mountain the shroud that is cast over all peoples, the sheet that is spread over all nations; God will swallow up death forever. Then the Holy One will wipe away the tears from all faces, and God will take away from all the earth the disgrace of people, for the Holy One has spoken.

The New Testament - Luke 24:1-12

On the first day of the week, at early dawn, Mary Magdalene and the other women came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again."

Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest of them. Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.

The Continuing Testament - by L. Susan Bond - in *Lectionary Homiletics* [edited]

The first witnesses found the empty tomb to be a total surprise. They went looking for death, expecting it, preparing for it, ready to ritually acknowledge it. They were ready for almost anything but what they found. "Why do you seek the living among the dead?" asked the dazzling strangers....We can ask ourselves the same question, every time we are tempted to relegate Jesus to some past history, every time we approach the Communion Table as if we were reenacting a funeral service for a poor departed friend. Why do we forget that Christ is risen, and have to be reminded again and again?

The two men in dazzling clothes scold the women, and suggest that they should have known better. Jesus had instructed them what to expect, so why were they so surprised that he was right? The two men made them remember Jesus' own words, and as the words came back to the women, they begin to believe. ▶

They believed because of what they had been told. We are told the same thing over and over, by the Church, by the Scriptures, by creeds, by the words of Jesus himself: "Behold, I am with you always!" Always! Without fail, without exception, Risen and alive and actively working in the world.
