TYLER KNOTT GREGSON (b. 1981) is a <u>poet</u>, <u>author</u> and professional <u>photographer</u> based in <u>Helena</u>, <u>Montana</u>. Gregson has accrued fame as a poet on social media platforms such as <u>Tumblr</u>, <u>Instagram</u> and <u>Twitter</u> since 2009. He writes and posts a "Daily Haiku on Love," and a raw poem from his "Typewriter Series" every day currently.

The "Typewriter Series" was born in 2012 when Gregson found an old typewriter in a Helena antique store and typed out a poem spontaneously. He said, "I just did it all at once and it was like stream of consciousness, I didn't plan it or think it through—I just let it go." The poet now challenges himself to post one of these every single day.

Gregson's main incentive for writing is to express that <u>poetry</u> is not dead and is something to be valued. Writing about various themes like <u>love</u>, <u>hope</u>, <u>sadness</u>, and <u>wanderlust</u>, has enabled his readers to relate their own experiences to his words. Gregson has enticed readers by inspiring them to view the world in a different light.

Mr. Gregson's first poetry book, "Chasers of the Light," became a national bestseller with more than 120,000 copies in print. Perigee, a division of Penguin Random House, picked up Gregson's "Typewriter series" and published selected poems from it into a compilation called *Chasers of the Light* in 2014. The collection of poetry was a top 10 bestseller of non-fiction within its second week of publication, according to the *Wall Street Journal*.

The Readings

Old Testament Reading - Isaiah 35:1-7, 10

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory and majesty of our God.

Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who are of a fearful heart, "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God. God will come with justice, with awesome recompense. God will come and save you."

The eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy. For waters shall break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert; the burning sand shall become a pool, and the thirsty ground springs of water; the haunt of jackals shall become a swamp, the grass shall become reeds and rushes.

And the ransomed of God shall return and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

The New Testament - Matthew 7:31-37

Then he returned from the region of Tyre and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue.

Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Eph'phatha," that is, "Be opened." And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. They were astounded beyond measure, saying, "He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak."
