

Lighting the Advent Wreath - The Candle of Love

[As the Candles are lighted, we will sing the following verse of One Candle Is Lit]

Leader: To Hope and Peace and Joy we now add our final candle before the Christ candle itself: the candle of Love.

Leader: Let us worship the God who loves us!



Readings

The New Testament - 1 John 4: 7-12

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.

Extra-Biblical Thought

"Now, if someone should ask, why then did God not appear using some other, nobler part of creation, or use some nobler instrument, such as the sun, ▶

or moon, or stars, or fire, or air, instead of merely using a human being? Let them know that the Lord came not to put on a show, but to heal and to teach those who were suffering. 2. You see, the way for one trying to put on a show would be, just to appear, and to dazzle the beholders; but for one seeking to heal and teach the way is, not simply to show up here, but to give himself to the aid of those in need, and to appear as those who need him can bear it, so that he might not, by exceeding the requirements of the sufferers, trouble the very people that need him, making God's appearance useless to them, 3. Now, nothing in creation had gone astray with regard to their notions of God. save humans only. Why, neither the sun, nor the moon, nor the heavens, nor the stars, nor water, nor air had swerved from their order; but knowing their Maker and Sovereign, the Word, they remain even now as they were made. But humans alone, having rejected what was good, then devised big nothings instead of the truth, and have ascribed the honor due to God, and their knowledge of God, to demons and people in the shape of stones. 4. It makes sense, then, since God's own divine goodness shouldn't overlook such a bad situation, that God should act even while humans were unable to recognize that it was God ordering and guiding the whole universe. So God decided to take a part of that whole, a tiny part, the human body, and unite God own self with that, so that, even if humans couldn't recognize God in the whole universe, they could at least recognize God in this human part; and since they couldn't look up to God's invisible power, they might, at least, be able to reason to God and to contemplate God from what resembled themselves." St. Athanasius, On the Incarnation
