

The Readings

New Testament Reading: Colossians 3:12-21

Because you are God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with heartfelt compassion, with kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. Bear with one another; forgive whatever grievances you have against one another—forgive in the same way God has forgiven you. Above all else, put on love, which binds the rest together and makes them perfect.

Let Christ's peace reign in your hearts since, as members of one body, you have been called to that peace. Dedicate yourselves to thankfulness. Let the Word of Christ, rich as it is, dwell in you. Instruct and admonish one another wisely. Sing gratefully to God from your hearts in psalms, hymns and songs of the Spirit. And whatever you do, whether in speech or in action, do it in the name of Jesus, giving thanks to God.

You who are in committed relationships, be submissive to each other. This is your duty in Jesus the Christ. Partners joined by God, love each other. Avoid any bitterness between you. Children, obey those responsible for you, for this is what pleases God the most. To those responsible for children, do not nag them, lest they lose heart.

Gospel: Matthew 2: 13-15, 19-23

After the astrologers had left Herod, the angel of God suddenly appeared in a dream to Joseph with the command, "Get up, take the child and his mother and flee to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you otherwise, Herod is searching for the child to destroy him." Joseph got up, awakened Jesus and Mary, and they left that night for Egypt. They stayed there until the death of Herod, to fulfill what God had said through the Prophet: "Out of Egypt I have called my Own."

After Herod's death, the angel of God appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt with the command, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and set out for the land of Israel. Those who had designs on the life of the child are dead."

Joseph got up, awakened Jesus and Mary, and they returned to the land of Israel. Joseph heard, however, that Archelaus had succeeded Herod as Ruler of Judea, and Joseph was afraid to go back there. Instead, because of a warning received by Joseph in a dream, the family went to the region of Galilee. There they settled in a town called Nazareth. In this way, what was said through the prophets was fulfilled: "He will be called a Nazarene."

Continuing Testament: An excerpt from *The Law of Caring,* by Joan Chittister

Each of us, whether we have children or not, gives birth to the next generation. We do it by being either wise or foolish, loving or hostile, arrogant or humble in their presence.

No parents are typical. No parents are perfect. We do not honor them for that. We honor them because they did what they could in making us what we are. The rest we were meant to do for ourselves.

Those who have parented us in life are those we carry inside ourselves forever. The goodness they have shown us deserves to be brought out into the light so that others, too, can bask in their ongoing glory—this time in us.

No wonder "honor" is a commandment. Not to honor those who have carried us through any part of life is a sin against the Creator who goes on creating us through the work of others.

To have authority over others does not mean to have control of them. It means simply that we must have love for them. Or, as Garrison Keillor says it: "Parents should sit tall in the saddle and look upon their troops with a noble and benevolent and extremely nearsighted gaze." Don't see too much or you will spoil their opportunity to see it themselves.

Being older than someone else or in a higher position than someone else does not endow us with eternal truth. It simple means that we must learn to listen with a wiser ear. The purpose of "parenting," of companioning the young, the novice, the stranger through the traces of life is not to make them dependent. It is to make them independent. The purpose of parenting is to make ourselves unnecessary. "I am not you anymore." Saundra Sharp wrote, "I am my own collection of gifts and errors."
