

## ***Pastor's Ponderings.....***

### **Dealing with the Coronavirus**

*"I looked and there was a pale green horse! Its rider's name was Death, and Hades followed with him; they were given authority over a fourth of the earth, to kill with sword, famine, and pestilence, and by the wild animals of the earth." Revelation 6:8*

The Coronavirus is sweeping around the earth like a plague from the Apocalypse: nations are closing their borders; states are closing their schools; cities are closing their bars and restaurants. Our church has closed its in-person services.

Still, in faith we continue to be God's people and God's community online, using technology to come together while maintaining the social distance scientists recommend to stop the spread of this deadly pandemic. Our worship, our prayers, our caring for each other, all continue unceasingly.

As I write this on March 16<sup>th</sup>, there is still a great deal of uncertainty about what will happen. Will the United States escape the devastation that has already afflicted China, Iran, Italy, and Spain, or, more likely, will its name be joined to the list of countries that are suffering visible pain from an invisible virus?

Whatever the case, we can be sure that God has not forgotten us. The Apocalypse itself contains some terrifying images along the way, but the end of the story is triumphant: *"God will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away. 'See,' [God says], 'I am making all things new.'"* (Revelation 21:4-5)

In the meantime, we work out our lives in the midst of chaos and trouble, just as they did in Bible times, waiting on the One who has always proven faithful in the past. As Lent draws to a close, it reminds us that God's will sometimes leads through a cross before resurrection comes...but that resurrection will surely come!

***Matthew 6:27 Jesus said, “Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?”***

***This is a stressful time, and stress can make you sick. It weakens your immune system and raises your blood pressure and blood sugar. It increases your risk of heart attack, gives you headaches, causes insomnia.***

***The Eastern Orthodox church has a meditation mantra that can help relieve stress. It is: “Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior, have mercy upon me, a sinner.” As you say each repetition, take one word at a time and focus on it: After repetition 1: what does it mean for Jesus to be Lord? After repetition 2: Who is this Jesus? Repetition 3: Why does he have this title, Christ? and so forth. Do the repetitions slowly. Don’t hurry. Take a deep breath in and out before each one. At the end, hand your worries over to God. Don’t take them back again!***

#### **Worshiping Together in a Virtual Way**

Here are some further instructions for our current approach to online/dial-in worship, using the ZOOM conference service. There are two ways to join:

**1. PHONE:**

If you want to call in:

**Dial-in Worship Service:**

then enter meeting ID (followed by the # sign):

During the call, you can unmute yourself by pressing \*6, to say something that all will hear. Then press \*6 to mute yourself again. Hang up at the end of the service.

## 2. COMPUTER / SMARTPHONE / IPAD:

If you want to connect with your computer, follow this link:

If you have not used Zoom before, you may have to download the app the first time you click on the link with your computer.

If you have a smart phone or iPad, you can go to the app store and search for Zoom Cloud Meetings:



When you click or the link from the email or start the Zoom app on your phone, you may not automatically go into our meeting. If so, press the Join a Meeting button, then you get a screen that asks you for the Meeting ID. Enter: 478 070 5901.

Join a Meeting


In general, you should use your computer/smartphone/iPad's audio. If you have turned on your video camera, it gives you a chance to see what others will see when you join the meeting.

In general, to ensure the best listening experience for everyone, you should be "on mute" most of the time, unless you have something specific to say to everyone.

During the service, you should see these controls:

- on the lower left of your computer screen

- on the lower left of your smart phone
- on the upper right of your iPad



People can see and hear you


People cannot see you, but they can hear you

People can see you, but cannot hear you

No one can see or hear you  
*(best for everyone else on the call)*

The controls show what will happen when you click on them. You toggle between “on” and “off” settings. On your smartphone & iPad, these controls also alternate between red and green.


A check has been sent to the Open & Affirm Coalition in the amount of \$446. Thank you for your support.
