

Readings

Jonah: A Modern Retelling

The First Lesson - Jonah 1

The word of Yahweh came to Jonah son of Amittai, and said, ² "Go east right now to the great city of Nineveh in Iraq, and call them out, because their wickedness stinks to high heaven" ³ But Jonah set out in the other direction, to flee across the Mediterranean to Tarshish, far from God's presence. He went down to the port of Joppa, booked a ticket, and climbed aboard the first ship heading west, to get away from God.

⁴ But God blew up a great wind on the waters, and such a huge storm came up that the ship was in danger of coming apart at the seams ⁵ The sailors were afraid, and each of them cried out to their own god for help. It got so bad that they threw all their cargo into the sea, to lighten the ship and keep it afloat.

Jonah, meanwhile, was fast asleep down in the hold of the ship ⁶ The captain came down and said to him, "What the hell are you doing down here sound asleep? Get up, and call on your god like the rest of us! Perhaps your god will spare us a thought so that we don't all die."

⁷ The sailors [a] said to one another, "Okay, let's cast lots and see whose fault this is." So they cast lots, and the lot fell on Jonah. ⁸ Then they said to him, "What have you done to bring this disaster on us? What's your job? Where do you come from? What's your country? What people are you from?" ⁹ "I am a Hebrew," Jonah replied. "I worship Yahweh, the God of heaven, who made the sea and the dry land." ¹⁰ Then the men were even more afraid. They said to him, "What's your problem, and why is this happening to us?" At this point, the men all knew that he was fleeing from Yahweh's presence, because he had told them so.

¹¹ Then they said to him, "What do we have to do to you to make the sea go calm?" because the waves were getting bigger and bigger. ¹² He said to them, "Pick me up and chuck me overboard and the sea will quiet down; I know it's my fault that this great storm has hit the ship." ¹³ In spite of Jonah's words, the men tried rowing hard first, to bring the ship back to land, but the more they rowed, the less headway they made, because the sea pushed back against them ¹⁴ Then they cried out to Jonah's god, "Please, O Yahweh, we pray, don't let us die because of this guy. Don't hold

us guilty for throwing him overboard if this man is innocent, because this is all just as you wanted, Yahweh." ¹⁵ Then they picked up Jonah and tossed him overboard into the sea; and the sea stopped raging right away. ¹⁶ Then the men were even more scared of Yahweh, and they offered a sacrifice to Yahweh and made vows.

¹⁷ As for Jonah, Yahweh provided a big fish to swallow him up; and Jonah was in the fish's stomach for three days and three nights.

The Second Lesson - Jonah 2:10-3:10

2¹⁰ While Jonah was in the fish's stomach, he composed a Psalm to pass the time. Finally, Yahweh spoke to the fish, and it vomited Jonah up onto the dry land. **3** Then the word of Yahweh came to Jonah a second time, and said, ² "Get up and go east to the great city of Nineveh in Iraq, and tell them what I told you to say." ³ This time Jonah set out for Nineveh to do what God said. Now Nineveh was a really big city; it took like three days to walk across it. ⁴ Jonah headed into the city, going about a day's walk in. And then he cried out, "In forty days Nineveh's doomed" ⁵ And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, from the greatest to the least, put away their regular clothes and put on uncomfortable and unfashionable sackcloth to show their repentance.

⁶ When the news reached the king of Nineveh, he got up from his throne, took off his robe, put on miserable sackcloth, and sat in a heap of ashes. ⁷ Then he had this proclamation ring out across Nineveh: "By decree of the king and his nobles: No human or animal, no herd or flock, shall have anything to eat or drink. ⁸ Humans and animals shall all wear sackcloth, and they shall all cry mightily to God. All humans and animals shall turn from their evil ways and from their accustomed violence. ⁹ Who knows? God might relent and God's mind might change. Maybe God's anger will be appeased by all this, and we might not all die.

¹⁰ When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God's mind changed about the disaster God had planned to bring upon them, and God didn't do it.

The Final Testament - Jonah 4

But this really pissed Jonah off, and he got really mad. ² He prayed to Yahweh and said, "Yahweh! This is just what I said would happen when I was back at home. This is why I took off for Tarshish in the first place; I know you! I know that you're always finding a way to be gracious. I just knew you'd find a reason to be merciful. You are always so slow to get angry about things, and so full of constant love, and so ready to let the punishment go. ³ Kill me now, Yahweh, I'd rather die than live like this!" ⁴ And Yahweh said, "Is it really right for you to be this angry?" ⁵ Then Jonah left the city and went off to the east of it. He made a little lean-to for himself there and sat under it in the shade, waiting to see whether God would destroy the city after all.

⁶ Yahweh made a bush grow up over Jonah while he was waiting, to give him some extra shade and make him more comfortable; Jonah was very happy about the bush. ⁷ But as the first fingers of dawn came up the next day, God sent a worm to eat the bush, and it withered away. ⁸ When the sun fully rose, God sent a miserably hot and humid east wind to blow on Jonah, and set the sun to beat down on Jonah's head so that he felt faint and asked God to let him die. Jonah said, "I'd rather die than have to live like this."

⁹ But God said to Jonah, "Is it really right for you to be this angry about a bush?" And Jonah said, "Yes, it is. I'm angry enough to die." ¹⁰ Then Yahweh said, "You're so concerned about a bush, for which you put in no work, that just grew up for you without any effort on your part. It came into being in a night and died in a night. ¹¹ And you think I shouldn't be concerned about the great city of Nineveh, where more than a hundred and twenty thousand people live, people who don't even know their right hands from their left? And a lot of animals live there too. What about them?"
