

## *Pastor's Ponderings.....*

Lauren F. Winner (in Still: Notes On A Mid-Faith Crisis) quotes ethicist Samuel Wells, who says that some stories feature heroes, and some stories feature saints, and the difference between them matters. “Stories told with heroes at the center of them are told to laud the virtues of the heroes – for if the hero failed, all would be lost. By contrast, a saint can fail in a way that the hero can’t, because the failure of the saint reveals the forgiveness and the new possibilities made in God, and the saint is just a small character in a story that’s always fundamentally about God.”

What kind of story are we telling with our lives? Are we trying to be heroes whose virtues are going to be praised, upon whom everything depends? Or will we try to be saints, leaving the center of the story to God, where our successes win God’s praise, and even our failures can be redeemed?

It’s sometimes not easy to say, is it? It’s tempting to be the hero. After all, who wouldn’t want to be the center of their own story? Who wouldn’t want to feel like it all depended on them, that their success was critical? That’s only human; it just feels right a lot of the time. And yet it means there’s a lot of pressure on us not to mess up, and messing up is human, too. If the hero fails, that’s it. It’s over. “The End” – we’ve written a tragedy.

But the saint, ah the saint. Not so tempting to decenter ourselves. It’s just not the way we were taught to think about ourselves in our society. Looking Out For Number One is easier if it’s clear that we’re number one. But if God is number one, that’s different. That’s harder. But the saint has a crucial advantage: if the saint fails, and falls, the story is far from over. In the saint’s story, there’s always resurrection, which comes from the Latin word “re-surgere,” which means, literally, to get back up on your feet again! Face plant and it seems like The End – but it’s not, we get lifted back up on our feet. We’ve written a comedy, which is just like a tragedy, at least according to the ancients, in that both are often filled with pain and suffering. But the difference is that, instead of ending in sadness, it ends in an unexpected joy, and happiness.

What sort of story are you telling with your life? Are you trying to be a hero or a saint? It can make all the difference.



### **Worshiping Together in a Virtual Way**

Here are some further instructions for our current approach to online/dial-in worship, using the ZOOM conference service. There are two ways to join:

## 1. PHONE:

If you want to call in:

### **Dial-in Worship Service:**

(our new phone number) 1-929-205-6099

then enter meeting ID (followed by the # sign):

478 070 5901 #

During the call, you can unmute yourself by pressing \*6, to say something that all will hear. Then press \*6 to mute yourself again. Hang up at the end of the service.

## 2. COMPUTER / SMARTPHONE / IPAD:

If you have not used Zoom before, you may have to download the app the first time you click on the link with your computer.

If you have a smart phone or iPad, you can go to the app store and search for Zoom Cloud Meetings. It looks like this:



When you click or the link from the email or start the Zoom app on your phone, you may not automatically go into our meeting.


If so, press the [Join a Meeting](#) button, then you get a screen that asks you for the Meeting ID. Enter: **478 070 5901**.

In general, you should use your computer/smartphone/iPad's audio. If you have turned on your video camera, it gives you a chance to see what others will see when you join the meeting.

To ensure the best listening experience for everyone, you should be “on mute” most of the time, unless you have something specific to say to everyone.

During the service, you should see these controls:

- on the lower left of your computer screen
- on the lower left of your smart phone
- on the upper right of your iPad



People can see and hear you

People can see you, but cannot hear you. (*Best for everyone else on the call*)

The icons show you the current status. The words underneath say what will happen when you click on them. You toggle between “on” and “off” settings. On your smartphone & iPad, these controls also alternate between red and green.

You can type a note that anyone can see by clicking on and then typing your message.

or just exit the app.
