CALL TO WORSHIP

† Leader (Sue): The time has come to join with Jesus as he journeys to Jerusalem.

- † PEOPLE: Walk with us on this journey, O Lord Jesus, as we travel into our souls and seek to free the light that is within. Amen

Second Reading (read by Pastor Allan) Psalm 51: 1-17

A Psalm of David, when the prophet Nathan came to him, after he had gone to Bathsheba

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin. For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me. Against you, you alone have I sinned, and done what is evil in your sight, so that you are justified in your sentence and blameless when you pass judgment. Indeed, I was born guilty, a sinner when my mother conceived me. You desire truth in the inward being; therefore teach me wisdom in my secret heart. Purge me with hyssop and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow. Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones that you have crushed rejoice. Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities.

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit. Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you. Deliver me from bloodshed, O God, O God of my salvation, and my tongue will sing aloud of your deliverance. O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise. For you have no delight in sacrifice; if I were to give a burnt offering, you would not be please. The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

Gospel Reading Matthew 6: 1-6, 16-21

Jesus said, "Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Parent in heaven. So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Parent who sees in secret will reward you. And whenever you pray, do not be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, so that they may be seen by others. Truly, I tell you, they have received their reward

But whenever you pray, go into our room and shut the door and pray to your Parent who is in secret; and your Parent who sees in secret will reward you. And whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Parent who is in secret; and your Parent who sees in secret will reward you. Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

- † Leader (Sue): The ashes we have before us represent the burdens of our lives: the sin that constrains us, the guilt that enshrouds us, the worry that afflicts us, the troubles of our age that encumber us.
- † PEOPLE (EVELYN): We hand them over to Christ, who will bear them away. He marks us with his sign and frees us to be his people.
- † Leader: Let us take up our cross and carry it on our foreheads, disciples of Christ marked as belonging to him forever. Amen

RESPONSE AFTER RECEIVING THE ASHES

- † LEADER (SUE): The journey has begun with the ashes of repentance.
- † PEOPLE (EVELYN): The journey has begun with the promise of healing.
- † LEADER: The journey may be long, and the journey may be dangerous.
- † PEOPLE: The journey may be long, but we have Christ with us; we bear his sign on our foreheads.
- † LEADER: The ashes will wash away, as our sins were washed away in baptism. But the sign of Christ has marked us as his own, now and forever. Amen
