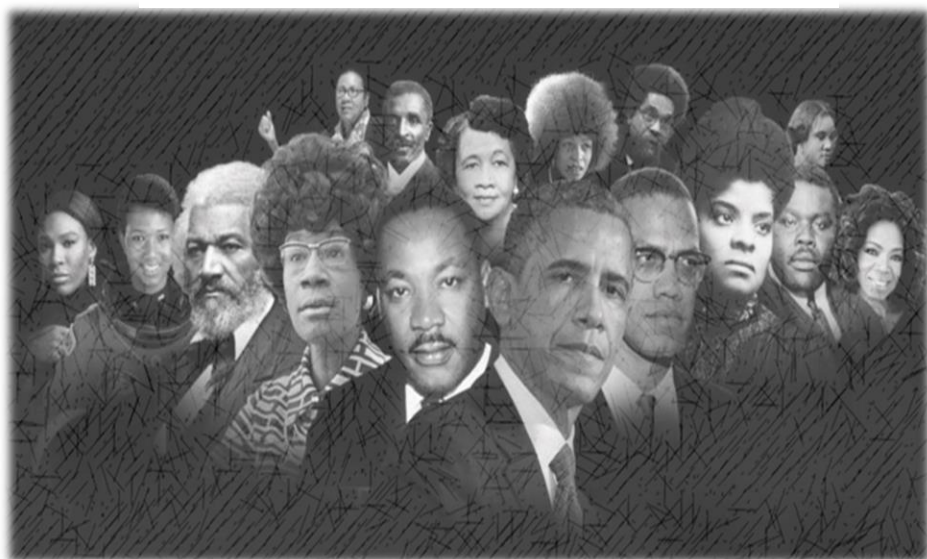

## ***Pastor's Ponderings.....***

February is Black History Month. Why should we, an almost entirely White congregation, care about Black History? In fact, why should we care about anyone's history at all?

Back in the 1980's there was a text-based computer game whose name I have forgotten. The premise was that you awoke in an empty bathtub not knowing who you were. You had no memory of how you got there or why you were in the bathtub. You were just in a situation that you didn't understand. The goal of the game was to discover your own identity. Without history, that's our situation. We are awaking with no memory of who we are or how we got into our present situation. History tells us what brought us to this moment, as well as why we have these scars in our national psyche and those warm feelings when we see a piece of red, white, and blue cloth.

Looking around, we might wonder why the median net worth of Black families is 1/10<sup>th</sup> that of White families. (Source: [brookings.edu](http://brookings.edu)) Without knowing Black history, we might be tempted to think that Blacks are lazy, or can't manage money, or bear some other personal fault as a race (some individual Blacks do have these qualities, as do some individual Whites, of course, as they are faults of the whole human race). But once we know history, we can see things differently. We know that much White wealth was built up because they had 246 years of unpaid labor from Blacks. We know that Whites massacred the wealthy Blacks of "Black Wall Street" in 1921 in the Tulsa Massacre, depriving them of the chance to pass on accumulated wealth to their descendants. We learn that Jim Crow "Black Codes" strictly limited opportunities for Blacks in many southern states. We discover that Blacks were left out of the housing provisions of the GI Bill because banks wouldn't make loans for mortgages to Blacks.

Further, the federal government, local governments, and the private sector also used a mechanism called “redlining” to keep Blacks out of certain neighborhoods and deprive them of goods and services available to whites. Perhaps we are shocked to learn that the New Deal’s Fair Labor Standards Act exempted domestic, agricultural and service occupations from its provisions - not coincidentally, the very occupations most likely to be carried out by Black workers. (Source: Rothstein, Richard, *The Color of Law: A Forgotten History of How Our Government Segregated America*) In all of these ways, and many more, Whites were able to accumulate wealth while Blacks were denied the opportunity. When Blacks did accumulate wealth, White rioters stole it, or destroyed it, and drove Blacks away without compensation.

When we remember Black History, we understand our own society better. And we understand the injustices that we, as Christians, are called upon to put right. Too often, Christians have been on the wrong side of the racial justice issue. Knowing Black history better will help us to have empathy with our Black fellow citizens, and to do as the prophet Micah said:

*“What does the LORD require of you:  
to do justice, and to love kindness,  
and to walk humbly with your God.”*

### **STEWARDSHIP**

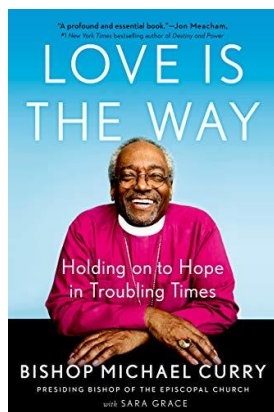

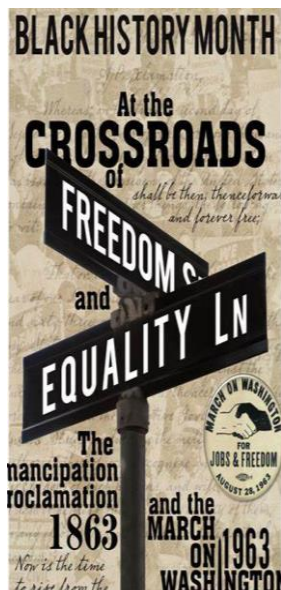
