FISH MEAL FUNDRAISER - The BUCC sold a total of 296 meals on Friday! We sold 36 individual hot lunch

meals and 65 dinners-for-4. Of the 65 four-pack dinners, 34 were donated by BUCC members and delivered to St. Augustine's Hunger Center on Friday morning – so thanks to your generosity, 136 individual meals went to feeding hungry folks in Cleveland! The food was prepared in Pilgrim Hall, by the Tri-C Culinary Arts students and their Chef instructor. Once we've gotten an actual cost for the food and packaging (which will be provided by Tri-C and will not exceed 20% of the individual dinner cost), we'll report back with the final total for funds raised by this event.

Readings

First Reading: 1st Corinthians 1: 18-25 The Foolish Cross

For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written: "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise; the intelligence of the intelligent I will frustrate."

Where is the wise person? Where is the teacher of the law? Where is the philosopher of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since in the wisdom of God the world through its wisdom did not know him, God was pleased through the foolishness of what was preached to save those who believe. Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified: a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those whom God has called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.

Second Reading (read by Pastor Allan): John 2:13-22 Jesus takes a whip

When it was almost time for the Jewish Passover, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple courts he found people selling cattle, sheep and doves, and others sitting at tables exchanging money. So he made a whip out of cords, and drove all from the temple courts, both sheep and cattle; he scattered the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. To those who sold doves he said, "Get these out of here! Stop turning my Father's house into a market!" His disciples remembered that it is written: "Zeal for your house will consume me."

The Jews then responded to him, "What sign can you show us to prove your authority to do all this?" Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days." They replied, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?" But the temple he had spoken of was his body. After he was raised from the dead, his disciples recalled what he had said. Then they believed the scripture and the words that Jesus had spoken.

Contemporary Reading: From *The Crazy Ones,* by Rob Siltanen and Others working on Apple's "*Think Different*" campaign
