REOPENING PLANS - The current target date to reopen our doors is June 13th – these are some of the differences you will see:

Masks will be recommended but optional for adults, and children under 12 yrs.old should wear them at the discretion of their parent(s). We will still work to spread people out in the sanctuary, and we're asking the congregation to forgo singing hymns (for now). As is typical for the summer months, there will be no choir, and we will reassess singing hymns and starting up the choir in the Fall. Instead of passing the collection plate, we will station them at the sanctuary doors, and we will implement "Bring Your Own Communion" for the next week. There will not be a coffee hour downstairs, but people are more than welcome to gather outside of church.

We will bring back singing hymns, shared Communion, Time with Young Worshipers and Coffee hour, as soon as safe and practical. However, if there is a spike in COVID cases, we may institute other precautions (temperatures, pre-registration, go back to virtual services etc.). Please remember to be flexible and patient as we see how things work when we are together. If there's one thing we've all learned from the pandemic, it's that situations and guidelines can change from day to day!
