Pastor's Ponderings.....

“And Mary gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.” – Luke 2:7

“Into this world, this demented inn in which there is absolutely no room for him at all, Christ comes uninvited.” – Thomas Merton

The world that Jesus was born into had no room for him. It had no room for him when he was in his mother's womb, so he was born in a stable, and laid in a manger, a trough where the animals ate.

King Herod had no room for Jesus after the wise men came seeking the newborn baby who was born 'king of the Jews.' There was only room enough for one king in this world. Herod killed all the male babies born in Jerusalem in the last two years, just to be sure, but Jesus had already escaped from Judea to Egypt and survived the massacre.

The Pharisees and the Sadducees and the chief priests had no room for Jesus and his radical new theology. Jesus put love and human need above the rules of the Law, all while claiming that his actions fulfilled the Law. They tried to trick Jesus, dishonor him, and discredit him. Ultimately, they worked to have him put to death, because their world had no room for him.

Rome had no room for Jesus. Jesus called for an allegiance which was higher than nationalism, higher than patriotism, higher than race, or class, or party. Rome already had an emperor who was owed total allegiance, and Caesar wasn't sharing any room with Christ. Rome put Jesus to death.

And yet, even when people were unwilling to make room for him, Jesus found a way to make room for himself. That's why the dying words of the Emperor Julian the Apostate (d. A.D. 363), who had tried to turn the Empire back to paganism after its conversion to Christianity, were "*Vicisti Galilaei*", which means "You have won, O Galilean."

As Thomas Merton said, *Jesus comes into this world uninvited*. But once here, he found a place in the hearts of the little people, of the poor and the outcast, of the downtrodden and the picked on. He found a place in the lives of those who thought their lives were over and were struggling with despair. He found a place in the consciences of those whose consciences wouldn't give them peace until Jesus arrived. And he found a place in the hopes of those who were facing death, their own or of someone they loved. The baby born in Bethlehem and resurrected in Jerusalem, will always find a place with those who let him in. In a world still too ready to reject Jesus, may he find a place with you this Advent time. Amen


SIGNING UP TO HELP WITH SUNDAY WORSHIP – Here are some instructions to explain how the Virtual Signup Sheet works. In summary:

1. Every week, an email is sent out with a link to the virtual signup sheet for the coming weeks. Please note that the email will come from:
buccoffice23_rt+gmail@breezechms.com
which you may need to add to your contact list, so the email does not go into spam. The subject will always be “Sunday Worship Sign Up” Sheet”.
2. Clicking on the link (which is tailored just for you) takes you into the signup sheet.
3. You can scroll through the different roles, seeing who is signed up for each week. As seen on a computer, the list shows 4+ dates across. Dates highlighted in blue mean you have already signed up, and a **bold date** means that at least one opening exists. If the date is grayed out, it means that all positions have been filled.
4. You can click on any open date and sign up.
5. You can also click on any date with your name on it to opt out of that week.
6. Then press [Submit] to record your changes.
7. You can use that same link as many times as you like.

Sign up for as many dates as you want. When you are done, press the [Submit] button to record your changes.

FACILITIES

RENTAL & MAINTENANCE – We have new tenants in the Arlington house. The rent has been increased from \$800 per month to \$850. We are purchasing a dehumidifier for the house's basement, at a cost of \$200, as the basement is very damp and we don't want any mold or health issues.

The church elevator is in need of repair, and an estimate is pending with Gable Elevator.

Contributions to the air conditioner fund have reached \$11,000+, out of the \$14,000 that it cost upon reopening. Thank you for your continued generosity!

We have been unable to secure a company to repair the parking lot/driveway this year. Companies are scheduling for spring. We will purchase some bags of cold patch to repair the area by Make A Wish, to get us through until spring.

We are still waiting on bids for the narthex and parlor lighting, as there are supply issues.

UCC CHRISTMAS FUND OFFERING – On Sunday, December 19th, the Christmas Fund offering will be received. This offering helps to meet the needs of retired and low-income clergy, and lay employees of the UCC. The fund works throughout the year, not just during the Christmas season. The dollars given to the Christmas Fund go directly to those who have served or are serving the church, especially in moments of critical need. Included are health premium supplementation, monthly pension supplementation, Christmas "Thank You" gift checks, and emergency grants for such things as large medical expenses or home damage from natural disasters. Please be generous, as these funds are critical for a sustainable quality of life for these "veterans of the cross".

SPIRITUAL LIFE

➤ **GET READY FOR FELLOWSHIP HOUR!** – We will resume Fellowship Hour in all its glory starting on Sunday, December 5th, after the Congregational Meeting. In order for this to be successful, we need volunteers to help. The jobs are posted in Breeze for signups, descriptions are below:

- **Setup/Serve**: Two to three people who arrive by 9:30 to set up downstairs. This includes putting out the coffee/tea cart and any other beverages, setting out the snacks, plates, etc, and generally making sure that Fellowship Hall is ready before the service starts. They will also help out as needed with serving, during coffee hour. Detailed directions will be provided in the kitchen.
- **Snacks**: Two to three people who provide snacks for the Fellowship/Coffee Hour. This can include cookies, chips, pastry, fruit, etc. - generally enough for 50 people. You don't have to attend the service to provide the snacks, as they can be delivered during regular office hours the week before.
- **Cleanup**: Two people who stay through the end of Fellowship/Coffee hour to clean up and store any leftovers, clean and put away the beverage service equipment, and ensure that Fellowship Hall is left ready for the next event.

We are requesting that those who are not vaccinated continue to wear masks while in Fellowship Hall. For those that are fully vaccinated masks will be optional.
