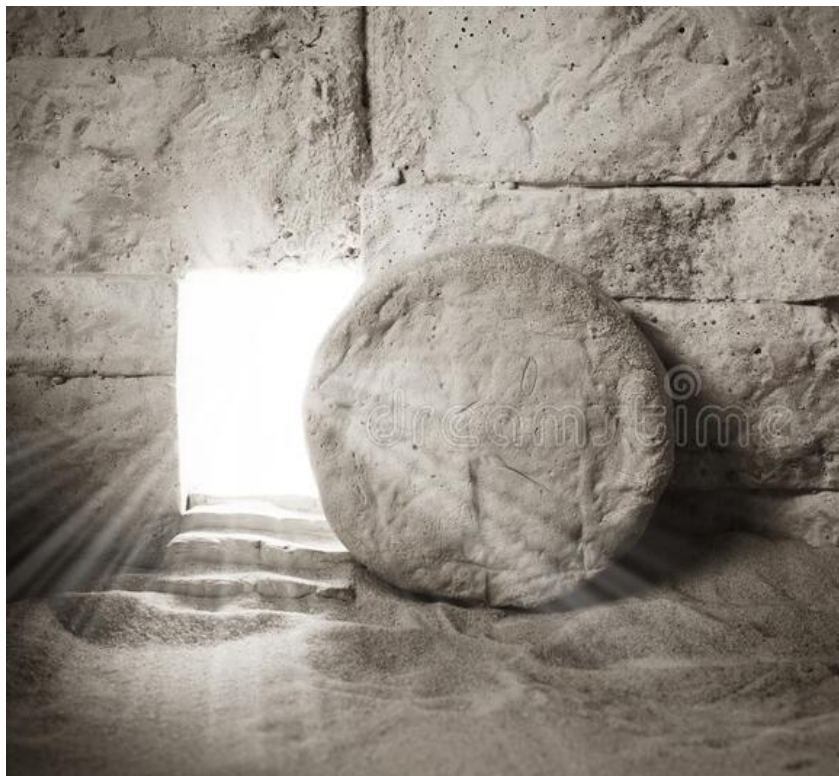

Pastor's Ponderings.....

April brings new life, growth and those proverbial showers that bring May flowers. April brings the Paschal Moon and the celebration of new life. Easter announces the victory of life over death and love over violence. Like the daffodils emerging from the tomb of winter, we are an emerging church.

It is lifegiving to see families return with people of all ages. When we gathered for the traditional Ash Wednesday soup and service, one person smiled and said, "Can't you just feel the place coming back to life?!" Yes, we can. Like spring, like Easter, we are emerging and coming back to life.

How exciting it will be for us to gather again for Easter and Holy Week, as a joyful resurrection people! As COVID-19 recedes in our rear-view mirror, our lives resume more familiar behaviors.

Yet in some ways, our lives are forever changed. Church Council is also recognizing ways that we can return to normal, and ways to change. BUCC Church Council decided to drop the mask mandate for in-person gatherings. Council also made some decisions about communion, which I'd like to share with you here.

BUCC Church Council decided to have communion once per month, on the first Sunday. Communion will also be shared on special days such as Christmas and Easter.

After the pandemic, it is possible that we'll never think about hygiene the same way. That influenced our discussion of "intinction" – the practice of multiple people dipping communion bread in a single chalice. Intinction is speedier than passing communion plates around the pews, but can seem a bit, well, unhygienic, especially if you're toward the end of the line. So, we've decided to try the following a "hybrid" approach to communion.

When it is time to receive communion, those who are able will process forward as we've done before with intinction. But instead of intinction, each person will take a piece of bread AND pick up a small communion cup. We'll carry the bread and cup back to our pews to receive communion together.

However, if walking is at all difficult for you, please don't worry about it. You can either remain seated, and we'll bring communion to you in your pew, or you could consume communion at the front of the line instead of carrying it back to your pew. That will free your hands to provide whatever support you may prefer (cane, walker etc.) as you walk back.

St. Paul writes "we, who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread" (1 Cor 10:17). Communion is a rich multidimensional symbol, packed with layers of meaning. One symbolic meaning is this idea that one bread is broken and shared. Jesus took bread, broke it, blessed it and gave it to his disciples. Likewise, we are one in Christ, symbolized in one bread that is blessed, broken and shared.

The next time we gather for communion, consider this powerful symbol. As one loaf is broken and shared, we contemplate that one body, mortally wounded on Calvary, shows God's salvation for all. We are many, yet we are one in Christ. We could spend a lifetime exploring the depths of these biblical ideas. They evoke the Passover, the Exodus, liberation of the oppressed, salvation, resurrection, service, unity in diversity and so much more.

So, watch for these new practices, and let the symbols speak to you. As always, please contact me anytime and let me know what you think.

Two hundred seventy five dollars was collected from members and sent. Others contributed directly online.

OCWM

OCWM (Our Church's Wider Mission) at BUCC is involved in multiple efforts to collaborate with and support our neighbors locally, nationally, and internationally.

Our current partnerships, activities, and beneficiaries include:

- Serving Community Meals (with a local collective of churches)
- Edna House for Women
- International Newcomers Academy
- Prentiss Autism Center (P.E.P. Day Treatment Center)
- The Refugee Response
- Sharing America's Resources Abroad (S.A.R.A.)
- Raise funds, services or collect items for individuals, families, or areas in need
- Annual "Last-Minute-Mart" during the month of December, to support a beneficiary identified by the Christian Education ministry

We also host book clubs, movie discussions, and special events surrounding issues of social justice and service. Ideas or suggestions for programming or activities are encouraged! BUCC is a "5 for 5" church, and holds annual collections for OCWM Basic Support as well as our four special mission offerings: Neighbors in Need; One Great Hour of Sharing; Strengthen the Church; and The Christmas Fund.

COMMUNION – We will be moving to once-monthly communion, starting on April 3rd. Going forward, communion will be offered on the first Sunday of the month, in a combined intinction/traditional format. Congregants will process down the middle aisle to receive individual bread and mini-cup portions of the elements, and will return to their seats via the side aisles. We believe this to be a safe, post-pandemic plan, that will allow for a meaningful and personal communion experience. As always, ALL are welcome!

MAUNDY THURSDAY - SOUP SUPPER IS BACK! Please join us in Fellowship Hall, for a soup supper at 6:30 pm on Thursday, April 14th. It will be followed by a service at 7:00 pm. If your last name begins with N-Z, please bring a loaf of bread to share.

GOOD FRIDAY TENEBRAE SERVICE - Jesus' death on the cross is a difficult, yet central component of the Easter story. Tenebrae is an ancient service that evokes primordial emotions of our journey from the comfort of light into the fearsome shadows of death. Please gather in the sanctuary on Friday, 4/15, at 8:00pm, as we remember Jesus' death on the cross and the undying power of God's love.

EASTER SUNDAY – Please join us for a sunrise service at 6:30am on Easter morning. It will be held at the Brecksville Cemetery, on the hilltop near the stone mausoleum. In case of rain, it will be at the church. At 10am, we will have our Easter service at BUCC.

MUSIC - Holy Week this year is scheduled for April 10 (Palm Sunday) through April 17 (Easter.) The seasonal choir will be presenting special music, including a rowdy piece called ***Hosanna in the Streets***, by Pepper Choplin; a stirring anthem on Maundy Thursday titled ***Rise Again***, by Dallas Holm; and two joyous anthems on Easter: ***To God Be Joyful***, by W. A. Mozart, and ***Away with Gloom, Away with Doubt!***, by Dave Debick. We hope you'll be able to join us for these services to commemorate the mysterious, inspiring events of Holy Week. For our regular Sunday morning worship services, flowers in the chancel area always add a special touch. BUCC is now using the computer program, “Breeze”, for folks to sign up to support/participate during the Sunday services, with “Flowers” listed as a category. If you care to provide flowers for the service, please put your name in the flower space, for the week you would like to do it. You will be bringing in an arrangement, cut flowers or a plant, and then taking it home or giving it to someone you care about.

Dedications are handled another way. There is a calendar on the wall just inside the double doors to the narthex. Please put your name on the calendar for the date you would like, complete a dedication form (located beneath the calendar), and turn it in with your payment to Joy Garapic.
