## Readings

### First Reading

#### James 2:2-8 (The Message)

If a someone enters your church wearing an expensive suit, and a person experiencing homelessness, wearing rags comes in right after, and you say to the one in the suit, “Welcome, sit here; this is the best seat in the house!” and either ignore the street person or say, “Better sit here in the back row,” haven’t you segregated God’s children and proved that you are judges who can’t be trusted?

Listen, dear friends. Isn’t it clear by now that God operates quite differently? God chose the world’s down-and-out as the kingdom’s first citizens, with full rights and privileges. This kingdom is promised to anyone who loves God. And here you are abusing these same citizens! Isn’t it the high and mighty who exploit you, who use the courts to rob you blind? Aren’t they the ones who scorn the new name—“Christian”—used in your baptisms?

You do well when you complete the Royal Rule of the Scriptures: “Love others as you love yourself.”

### Gospel Reading

#### Luke 19:1-10 (The Inclusive Bible)

Entering Jericho, Jesus passed through the city. There was a wealthy person there named Zacchaeus, the chief tax collector. Zacchaeus was trying to see who Jesus was, but he couldn’t do so because of the crowd, since he was short.

In order to see Jesus, Zacchaeus ran on ahead, then climbed a sycamore tree that was along the route. When Jesus came to the spot, he looked up and said, “Zacchaeus, hurry up and come on down. I’m going to stay at your house today.” Zacchaeus quickly climbed down and welcomed Jesus with delight.

When everyone saw this, they began to grumble, “Jesus has gone to a sinner’s house as a guest.” Zacchaeus stood his ground and said to Jesus, “Here and now I give half my belongings to poor people. If I’ve defrauded anyone in the least, I’ll pay them back fourfold.” Jesus said to the tax collector, “Today salvation has come to this house, for this is what it means to be a descendant of Sarah and Abraham. The Promised One has come to search out and save what was lost.”

## Readings

### **Continuing Testament — From *Becoming a Welcoming Church*, by Thom S. Rainer**

We church members are often clueless about what our guests are thinking and experiencing. We think we know because we know how we feel and think. But the perspectives of church members and guests are often vastly different.

Most of you have been a guest at a church. So let's replay the likely journey of visiting a church together. Keep in mind, this journey is especially important if you are looking at this church as a possible new church home.

Joining us on this journey are Kathy and Jim. They will be our guides because they are the ones who actually helped me visualize the issue not too long ago. Kathy and Jim really needed a good guest experience. They had a lot of frustration getting their three kids, all under the age of eight, ready for church. To exacerbate the tension, neither Kathy nor Jim had been in a church for a decade. They did not know what to expect.

Kathy said, "We really had an overall good experience. But, there was one part that just was not that good. It was the nine to ten minutes after we sat down in the worship space and before the services started. No one spoke to us. No one sat by us. No one even acknowledged us. It was really uncomfortable until the service began."

That, in essence, is one of the surprises we heard from guests. Even in incredible churches, very few members make the effort to greet and speak to someone already seated before the service begins. And, frankly, most church members don't ever go sit with guests. Guests are most often overlooked in the few minutes right before the worship services. No one speaks to them or sits with them.

They have a challenge I call the "holy huddle." The holy huddle takes place when members talk to other members they know without acknowledging the people they don't know.
