## ***Pastor's Ponderings.....***

*“Young people these days have bad manners and contempt for authority. They are disrespectful toward their elders and prefer idle chatter over exercise.” - Socrates*

A lot has changed in the 2,400 years since Socrates. But one thing has not changed. People my age complain about young people. Let me state boldly what's wrong with young people these days. Nothing – that's what.

I agree with writer Liz Gilbert, *“Today's American teenagers are the most sensitive, least violent, least bullying, least racist, least homophobic, most globally-minded, most compassionate, most environmentally-conscious, least dogmatic, and overall kindest group of young people this country has ever known.”*

They are quirky in ways I may never fully understand. I rarely get their TikToks or memes, or whatever they're called. OK - I can live with that.

Overall, young people these days were raised to be nicer than my generation was. They are taught to “use your words.” Compared to my generation, they are less likely to beat each other up, smoke, get drunk, or hurl insults based on ethnicity or sexual orientation. They accept - in fact - they demand diversity. They grasp the indisputability and the urgency of climate change. And they are eager to promote environmental justice.

They are on their cell phones constantly. OK – I can live with that too. But I see their ubiquitous smart phones as a sign of hope. I bet that, 500 years from now, the smart phone will be considered more historically significant than the invention of the printing press in 1455. Why? Because knowledge is power.

Here's an example: If I needed some obscure demographic data for my 8<sup>th</sup> grade report, I would walk to the library and look it up. It took hours. Now, it takes seconds to get better data.

Immense knowledge is suddenly at our fingertips - anytime, anywhere. It's a powerful tool. But power tools can be deadly. The real power lies in how we choose to use such tools. If knowledge is power – and it is – then wisdom is the decision to use that power for good, not evil.

What will these young people do with such unprecedented power? I can scarcely imagine. But I am an unrelenting optimist. I believe they will do something good – very good. It's going to be an interesting journey.

Did Johannes Gutenberg imagine that the knowledge propagated by his printing press would spark the Renaissance, Reformation, Age of Enlightenment, American Revolution, the scientific revolution, the digital revolution, the space age and much more? Unlikely. Nor is it likely that any of us alive today can grasp what the young people of this generation are about to do with the power they wield.

I believe that they are going to do something good.

On the first Sunday of October, our young people will meet to envision what a future youth ministry could look like. Please, let's encourage all of them to show up at BUCC for that day. I don't know what they will come up with, but I believe it will be good. I want to support and encourage them; I hope we all do.

St. Peter said, "In the days to come - it is our God who speaks - I will pour out my Spirit on all humankind. Your daughters and sons will prophesy, your young people will see visions, and your elders will dream dreams." (Acts 2:17)

Yes, that is what I see happening - new visions. Young people, I trust you to dream and lead the people of my generation to a place that is revolutionary and wonderful beyond our wildest ability to imagine. See you October 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Last week during the heavy rains, a leak developed in the roof of the Arlington property. Steps have been taken to make the appropriate repairs. Ceiling damage will also have to be addressed. Cost at this time has not been determined.

The gutters on the educational wing and the Arlington rental property have been cleaned. They were completely blocked, and seedlings had sprouted. The recent flooding in the educational wing was probably due to clogged gutters. The cost was \$450.

### ***My Favorite Part of Worship Service***

What is your favorite part of worship service? Let go, relax, and think about it.

One of our young people said she liked the happy hour. Other people have different ideas. Some like the Bible readings. This is an opportunity to study the teachings of Christ. Others like the sermon best. Some enjoy the choir's anthem or the music program.

My daughter likes the baptismal service best. She says the baptismal service makes her feel baptized again. First, she claims God's promises. Second, she renews her promises to God. And, finally, she thinks of becoming a member of the local church and taking part in the activities of that church.

The communion service is a favorite of some. We like it because we are following Christ's direction - "Do this in remembrance of me." This is a service for everyone in the church. Think back to classical paintings of "The Last Supper." And, if you think, this same communion service has existed since those paintings were new. That line of communion services has existed since Christ said, "do this in remembrance of me," through generation to generation to you.

**THINGS TO REMEMBER WHEN GETTING A COVID TEST** - To minimize the chance of getting a false negative test (often due to sampling errors), here are some things to remember:

1. Blow your nose (the virus does not occur in what is blown out)
2. Swab deeply to get enough sample, and for at least 15 seconds
3. The viruses grow and change rapidly
4. Test results may vary with differing manufacturers
5. False positive tests are rare
