





Anthem***Maranatha, Jesu***

"Maranatha Jesu" means "O Come Lord Jesus." The word "maranatha" is Aramaic, the language Jesus spoke at home. It means "O Lord, come." Maranatha is transliterated into Greek and used only once in the Bible (in 1 Cor. 16:22). It is equally possible to translate it as "Our Lord has come." And "Jesu" is simply the Latin word for "Jesus."

Based on the teachings of John Cassian (360 - 435 AD), John Main (1926 - 1982) recommended Maranatha as "the ideal Christian mantra." In meditation, it is repeated silently with each breath as four equally stressed syllables Ma-ra-na-tha: "Not only is this one of the most ancient Christian prayers, in the language Jesus spoke, but it also has a harmonic quality that helps to bring the mind to silence."

Readings

First Reading

Isaiah 2:1-4 (NRSV)

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem: In days to come the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. Many peoples shall come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob; that God may teach us ways of compassion and pathways of peace."

For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. God shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore.

Gospel Reading

Matthew 24:36-44 (NRSV)

"But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only our Creator. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Chosen One. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Chosen One.

Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, they would have stayed awake and would not have let their house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Chosen One is coming at an unexpected hour.

Continuing Testament – “Light”, by Michael Morwood, from *Prayers For Progressive Christians*

Thirteen and a half billion years ago, our universe began in an explosion of light and energy. The resulting cosmic wave pulsed, and continues to pulse, through everything that has ever existed, from the creation of galaxies and stars and the ongoing expansion of the universe, to the unfolding of life on this wonderful planet.

To be human is to experience this universal light and energy manifest in human form. This is the human story. It is the story of every human being. It was Jesus' story, too, although he did not know the scientific story we can tell today. Each human being has the opportunity to uniquely reveal the still-pulsing light and energy of the universe in his or her one and only lifetime...

As we gather today, let us give thanks for the human capacity for compassion, for goodness, for truth, for ingenuity and courage. These noble human qualities enable and give rise to possibility, challenge, improvement, and progress.

We give thanks for the many people who have exemplified these qualities for us; people who have shone brightly in our lives, strengthening our minds and hearts and helping to reveal the way ahead.

We give thanks that in and through these people we encountered the light and energy of the universe in human form.

We bring to mind the light revealed in Jesus. His life was a clear and unblemished expression of the energy and light within every person.

He acts as a mirror to us that we might see ourselves as no different from him; he – and we – are human expressions of the universal light blazing in all places, at all times.

His desire was to set people free from darkness from ignorance and from fear. He preached the possibility of a better human community if only people would recognize and trust the light that emanated from within and allowed it to shine.

We, too, seek to recognize and trust the universal light and energy emanating within us and allow it to shine; we seek to be the salt of the earth, to be like springs of water that won't run dry. We desire to keep our own light “on top of a lampstand”, strong and bright in every direction; a light that will radiate in moments of darkness and gloom infusing them with warmth and energy.

We set ourselves to be watchful, to be helpful to be hope-filled; to do all we can to ease suffering and distress and bring hope to a troubled world.
