





One: John the Baptist, while in the womb of his mother, expressed the joy of generations to come. The faith of Mary filled the unborn babe with joy.

All: May the light of Christ fill us with joy.

One: In a moment filled with hope, in a moment filled with peace, in a moment filled with joy, Mary opens her mouth to sing, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior..." Readings

First Reading

Isaiah 7:10-14 (The Inclusive Bible)

Once more YHWH spoke to Ahaz and said, "Ask for a sign from YHWH your God; let it be deep as the netherworld, or high as the sky!"

But Ahaz answered, "I will not ask! I will not put YHWH to a test!"

Then Isaiah said, "Listen, O House of David! Is it not enough for you to weary those around you, must you also weary my God? Therefore, the Holy One will give you a sign: This young woman will become pregnant and will give birth. You will name the child "Immanu-El" that is, "God is Among Us."

Gospel Reading

Matthew 1:18-25 (NRSV)

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly.

But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: "Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us."

When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.



Readings

Continuing Testament – From *Prayers for a Planetary Pilgrim* by Edward Hays

As we approach the winter solstice, the sun seems to have halted in its long southerly journey. It seems to have slowed and paused, deciding whether to continue moving away from Earth, lessening in its light. It is as if it were contemplating a headlong plunge outward into darkness.

The prospect of such a decision terrified our ancient ancestors and so gave birth to one of the primal holy days - or rather holy nights - the winter solstice.

Fearful that darkness and death would rule over the Earth, our ancient forebears circled sacred fires built on hilltops and in holy places. Roaring prayers of red and yellow flames petitioned the gods to bring back the sun. On the winter solstice, the Old Ones danced about fires and chanted hymns to the sun's glory. They wanted to awaken the sun, lest they and all creation die in the freezing darkness of an endless winter.

Watching and waiting are the ritual activities of the winter solstice. It is a sacred night, full of echoes. If you listen carefully, you can hear century-old chants. The ancient ones saw, in this cosmic event, the death of an old sun and the birth of an infant sun.

Wrapped in December darkness, those in the northern hemisphere also have made it a vigil feast of the birth of the Son of God, the Light of Lights, the Prince of Peace.
