

Readings

First Reading Isaiah 42:1-9 (NRSV)

Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations.

He will not cry or lift up his voice, or make it heard in the street; a bruised reed he will not break, and a dimly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice.

He will not grow faint or be crushed until he has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for his teaching.

Thus says God, the Eternal One, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people upon it and spirit to those who walk in it:

I am the Eternal One, I have called you in righteousness, I have taken you by the hand and kept you; I have given you as a covenant to the people, a light to the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness. I am the Eternal One, that is my name; my glory I give to no other, nor my praise to idols.

See, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth, I tell you of them.

Gospel Reading Matthew 1:1-17 (NRSVUE)

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now, for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness." Then he consented. And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw God's Spirit descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from the heavens said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased."

Continuing Testament – From Surrender: 40 Songs, One Story by Bono

On occasional Sundays, Guggi took me to Merrion Hall, a Holy Roller church meeting for the very evangelical...

"Are you saved yet?"

My mother was laughing when I came home that first night. She was familiar with the Boys Department kind of evangelizing. But listening to the speakers at these meetings, I was further attracted to the God of the Scriptures that they read from... I did have a sense of the divine, but it was inchoate and formless, so when I started to uncover clues about the nature of this presence, I was fascinated. The Bible held me rapt. The words stepped off the page and followed me home. I found more than poetry in that Gothic King James script.

Soon I started to enjoy a modern translation, the Good News Bible, which I discovered when I accompanied Guggi at a YMCA camp...

I'd always be first up when there was an altar call, the "come to Jesus" moment. I still am. If I was in a café right now and someone said, "Stand up if you're ready to give your life to Jesus," I'd be the first to my feet. I took Jesus with me everywhere and I still do. I've never left Jesus out of the most banal or profane actions of my life.
