

* Call to Prayer:

Leader: From the safety and comfort of home, God called Abram and Sarai to go from all they knew to embrace a future yet to be revealed.

Leader: By night, Nicodemus came seeking greater insight into the teachings of God for the journey set before him. Jesus called him out of the shadows and towards a life born anew.



Readings

First Reading: "The Call of Abram" Genesis 12:1-4 (The Inclusive Bible)

YHWH said to Abram, "Leave your country, your people, and the home of your parents, and go to a place I will show you. I will make of you a great people. I will bless you and make your name so great that it will be used in blessings. I will bless those who bless you, and I will curse those who curse you. And all the people on the face of the earth will be blessed through you." Abram, who was 75 years old when he left Haran, began the journey as YHWH had instructed, and his nephew Lot went with them.

Gospel Reading: "Nicodemus" John 3:1-9, 16-21 (The Voice & The Inclusive Bible translations)

Nicodemus was one of the Pharisees, a man with some clout among his people. He came to Jesus under the cloak of darkness to question Him.

Nicodemus said, "Teacher, some of us have been talking. You are obviously a teacher who has come from God. The signs You are doing are proof that God is with You."

Jesus said to Nicodemus, "I tell you the truth: only someone who experiences birth for a second time can hope to see the kingdom of God."

Nicodemus responded, "I am a grown man. How can someone be born again when he is old like me? Am I to crawl back into my mother's womb for a second birth? That's impossible!"

Jesus said, I tell you the truth, if someone does not experience water and Spirit birth, there's no chance they will make it into God's kingdom. Like from like. Whatever is born from flesh is flesh; whatever is born from Spirit (πνεῦμα/pneuma) is spirit (πνεῦμα/pneuma). Don't be shocked by My words, but I tell you the truth. Even you, an educated and respected man among your people, must be reborn to enter the kingdom of God. The wind (πνεῦμα/pneuma) blows all around us as if it has a will of its own; we feel and hear it, but we do not understand where it has come from or where it will end up. Life in the Spirit (πνεῦμα/pneuma) is as if it were the wind (πνεῦμα/pneuma) of God.

But Nicodemus said, "I still do not understand how this can be."

Jesus said, "God expressed love for the world in this way: God gave God's Son so that whoever believes will not face everlasting destruction, but will have everlasting life. Here's the point. God didn't send the Son into the world to judge; instead, He is here to rescue a world *headed toward certain destruction*. No one who believes in Him has to fear condemnation, yet condemnation is already the reality for everyone who refuses to believe, because they reject the name of the begotten Son of God."

Readings

Gospel Reading: (continued)

"Why does God allow for judgment and condemnation? Because the Light, sent from God, pierced through the world's darkness to expose ill motives, hatred, gossip, greed, violence, and the like. Still some people preferred the darkness over the light because their actions were dark. Some of humankind hated the light. They scampered hurriedly back into the darkness where vices thrive and wickedness flourishes.

Those who abandon deceit and embrace what is true, they will enter into the light where it will be clear that all their deeds come from God."

"In our tears and agony, we hold our children close and confront the truth: The future is dark.

But my faith dares me to ask: What if this darkness is not the darkness of the tomb, but the darkness of the womb?

What if all the mothers who came before us, who survived genocide and occupation, slavery and Jim Crow, racism and xenophobia and Islamophobia, political oppression and sexual assault, are standing behind us now, whispering in our ear: You are brave. What if this is our Great Contraction before we birth a new future?

Remember the wisdom of the midwife: "Breathe," she says. Then: "Push."

Now it is time to breathe. But soon it will be time to push; soon it will be time to fight - for those we love - Muslim father, Sikh son, trans daughter, indigenous brother, immigrant sister, white worker, the poor and forgotten, and the ones who cast their vote out of resentment and fear.

In the name of the Divine within us and around us, we find everlasting optimism. Within your will, may there be grace for all of humanity."

LENTEN SERIES — Mondays, February 27 – March 27 at 6:30 PM

Let's reflect on the meaning of Holy Week with the book, <u>The Last Week: What the Gospels Really Teach About Jesus's Final Days in Jerusalem,</u> by Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan. You may be familiar with Marcus Borg; last year we studied his book The Heart of Christianity.

Using the gospel of Mark as their guide, Borg and Crossan present a day-by-day account of Jesus's final week of life. Informed, challenged, and inspired by the biblical texts, we meet the historical Jesus, who engages us and invites us to walk with him.

This study will help us to understand what happened in Holy Week and why Jesus died. This reveals that Jesus calls us to personal transformation and action on behalf of the oppressed and disadvantaged.

Sessions will be "hybrid"; you can join either in-person or online. We'll meet in-person in the Parlor and online at **BrecksvilleUCC.org/announcements/calendar**.
