First Reading

Psalm 27 (Translation: Psalms Anew in Inclusive Language)

God, you are my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? You are the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?

When evildoers assail me, uttering slanders against me, my adversaries and foes, they shall stumble and fall. Though a host encamp against me, my heart will not fear; though war arise against me, yet I will be confident.

One thing have I asked of you, Yahweh, this I seek: to dwell in your house all the days of my life, to behold your beauty and to contemplate on your Temple. For you will hide me in your shelter in the day of trouble, you will conceal me under the cover of your tent and will set me high upon a rock. Gospel Reading Matthew 9:9-13, 18-26 (NRSVUE)
