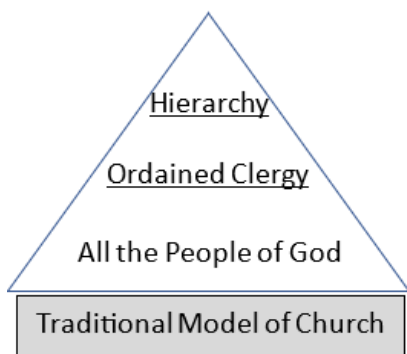

Pastor's Ponderings.....

I have a few running gags about ministry. One of them goes like this: family wants to schedule some event on Sunday. I'll say "I keep asking the church for Sundays off, but they don't listen to me." Here's another: somebody asks me about something going on at BUCC, but I don't know the answer. I'll joke, "Hey, I just work here." Yeah, sorry. "Dad jokes" are about the best I've got these days.

Both punch lines are based on the same premise: The UCC has a different ecclesiology than most churches. That word comes from the Greek, *ecclesia*, meaning *church*. So, ecclesiology is the field of theology that studies who we are as a church. What's our leadership structure? How does the church experience and affirm God's still speaking voice. Who decides? In the UCC, it's the congregation, not the pastor.

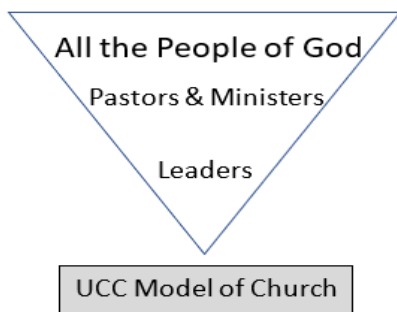
These two triangles illustrate, in a simplified way, the difference between the traditional model of church many of us grew up with, and the UCC ecclesiology. Traditionally, the pastor made the decisions; a good pastor would respectfully consult the congregation. But in the UCC, the congregation makes the decisions; a good congregation respectfully consults the pastor.



In the traditional model, a small hierarchy decides what the people do and believe. Depending on the denomination, this hierarchy likely includes bishops, perhaps even popes, cardinals, archbishops etc. They write official declarations, doctrines and dogmas. Clergy make a sacred pledge of obedience to the hierarchy and pass their doctrines on to the people. If you don't agree, you might hear, "hey, love it or leave it."

Pastor's Ponderings..... (continued)

The UCC model functions differently. *The people are the church.* While I've heard other church denominations say that, in the UCC, it is a reality that we live in our day-to-day practice. That means pastors need to listen more than we talk. It means I don't get a vote on church council. Governance of the congregation comes from the members, not their pastor.



I love this ecclesiology because it is more authentic. For *God's spirit moves among all of God's people.* We are at our best when we listen attentively and empathetically to one another. It also means that I can focus my attention where it belongs - on the pastoral care of the people, not administrative minutia.

A hundred years ago, engineers figured a big arena needed a big loudspeaker to get the message out. But the larger the arena, the more of an echo chamber it became; loud, but unintelligible. Newer spaces now use many small speakers instead of a few big ones. While the volume is the same, the message is heard more clearly. In the UCC, the clarity of our church's voice comes from many small speakers, not a few loud ones.

This summer I am driving to Indianapolis for the General Synod of the UCC. I'm honored to be a delegate representing you and the Living Water Association at the synod. Delegates will vote on resolutions and officers. These will guide the whole UCC denomination moving forward. But remember the inverted pyramid. Your voice matters. Please visit GeneralSynod.org/proposed-resolutions where you can see the proposed resolutions. Let me know your thoughts and I'll carry them with me to the General Synod.

The people are the church. I care about you; I care about your ideas, inspirations and opinions. I firmly believe that church is stronger when we respect the ability of each person to hear and respond to the gentle prodding of the Spirit, who speaks in and through the spirit of each member of the church, the body of Christ.

government funding, and so it relies on support from communities such as ours. Thanks for your generous support!

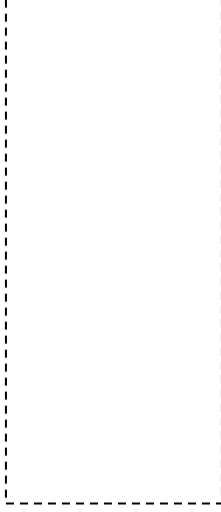
