Pastor's Ponderings.....

Religion and Politics

I've heard that politics and religion should not be mentioned in polite company. If that's the case, I'm about to get impolite.

To quote Rev. Jim Wallis, religion is deeply personal, but it is not private. Rather, our faith compels us to strive for justice, peace and compassion in the world around us.

It was that way for the prophets of old, like Zechariah, who said, "Render true judgments, show kindness and mercy to one another; do not oppress the widow, the orphan, the alien, or the poor" (7:10).

And it is that way for us. Our faith is personal, but not private.

Faith led Moses to stand before the Pharaoh and advocate for freedom. Faith led Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. to stand before the crowd assembled in Washington D.C. and advocate for civil rights. Faith leads us to advocate for laws and policies that are just and consistent with the teachings of our faith too.

But there are limits. As a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, we can endorse issues and policies. But we do not endorse individual candidates or political parties. That's not just a good idea, it's the law.

As a pastor, I abide by those limits. But as a citizen, I vote, donate, speak, march and campaign for the candidates I support. Sometimes that can look a little confusing, so I want to draw some very clear lines. When I am speaking in my position as pastor of Brecksville UCC, I abide by the limits that apply to all 501(c)(3) organizations. But when I am acting independently of this ministry, those rules do not apply.

Pastor's Ponderings.....(continued)

Pastors and congregations CAN endorse issues; we can't endorse parties or candidates. But as a citizen, I can and will endorse parties and candidates. I'll keep those dual roles separated, and I trust that when you observe my activism you can too.

If you ever feel that I've crossed any boundaries that I've described here, please let me know. I want to get this right. And it can get complicated in ministry, a vocation in which my work and my identity are so intertwined.

Since congregations *can* endorse issues, let's talk about one. At the last church council meeting, Brecksville UCC unanimously endorsed a "NO" vote on Issue One this August 8. This is consistent with the churches of Greater Cleveland Congregations (see www.greaterclevelandcongregations.org/issues/issue-1). It is also consistent with the resolutions passed by the 34th General Synod of the United Church of Christ (see www.ucc.org/general-synod-34-highlights).

Of course, we may disagree sometimes. If we talk long enough, we're bound to discover disagreements over politics, theology, and the Kardashians. Great! It would be pretty dull over coffee if we all agreed. When we disagree, let's agree to do so with deep respect and active listening.

Above all, get out and vote! Advocate for what you believe in. Support the policies and candidates that you believe are most in-line with your core values.

As a veteran, voting is a deeply patriotic duty and privilege that I never miss. As a follower of Jesus, voting is one of the most powerful ways to put my faith into action.

****Directions for Worship in the Park AND the Church Picnic****

The location for both events is **11550 Valley View Road**, at the **Sagamore Hills Twp. Park**, in the **Rose Mary Snell Pavilion**.

From BUCC: Head east on Rte. 82. After crossing the bridge to Sagamore Hills, make the first left turn onto Chaffee Road. At the end of Chaffee, turn right onto Valley View Road. The park is across from the Sagamore Hills Police Station on your right (approx. 1 mile.) We're meeting at the Rose Mary Snell Pavilion, which is in the very back of the park. So once you turn right into the park, continue straight onto the gravel road until it turns left. You will pass the ball diamonds and bathrooms, and then you'll see the only pavilion in that park. There is a drop-off area at the front of the pavilion - please leave the closest parking spots for those in need.

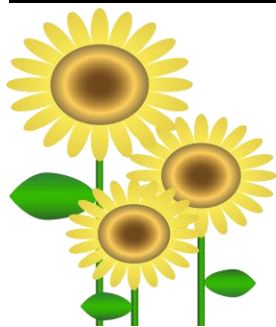
