

Pastor's Ponderings.....

I've ruined vacations. Yeah, sorry about that, Tim, Dan and Bill. But I think I figured out what went wrong. I went on vacation with the desire to have myself a great time. As a result, I was not kind to those who got in my way or delayed my arrival at the ski lift the moment it opened. I did not have a great time; and neither did they.

I've improved. The breakthrough came on one trip where I decided the primary goal of my vacation was actually to make sure THEY - my traveling companions - had a great time. Turns out, I had a good time too.

In the process, I discovered two things:

1. I was acting like a jerk, and I needed to knock it off.
2. I could apply the same principle to life.

It's an odd paradox. The harder I try to grab more for myself, the sadder I become. And the harder I work for the happiness of my travelling companions, the happier I became.

The greatest is the one who serves. Those who seek to lose their lives will find it. These are the words of Jesus. Surely, Jesus took a lot of vacations because he figured this out long before me.

Perhaps you have one of those Bibles with the words of Jesus printed in red letters. I'm a "red letter Christian." Because there's a lot of stuff in the Bible that is hard to swallow. The red letters, the words of Jesus, help decode, or even cancel, the bad stuff in the Bible.

My favorite example of a bad Bible verse is Psalm 137:9 *Blessed are they who take your babies and smash them against a rock.* I like babies. So, please don't do that.

And we don't need to try to explain it away to make it right. Simply put, it is in the Bible, it is wrong and we don't need to pretend it isn't. We can learn a lot from some of the weird stuff in the Bible. But we don't need to replicate it in our actions. The red letters help us to sort it out.

Technically, Moses became the first person to download a document from the cloud using a tablet. But if we believe that the entirety of the Bible came to us as some sort of instruction manual downloaded directly from God, then we're missing something important. The Bible was written by communities that experienced something sacred and tried to write it down. We study the Bible to sift the inspired message from the historical-cultural context in which it came. Because when we've taken the cultural context as eternal truth our faith has made us into real jerks sometimes.

But if we look at the red letters, the black letters have a kind of filter. Did you ever play the game, "Password?" As a kid, I rarely played Password. But I was intrigued by the cards. The cards had different colored letters that were all scrambled up. It was difficult to read them until I put them in the sleeve. The sleeve had a red cellophane window, which filtered out all but certain letters. That made it easy to understand a once difficult text.

For me, the red letters of Jesus are the key to unlock all the other texts. Without them, adhering to selective Bible texts could make me into a misogynistic, homophobic, judgmental, racist, slave-beating, polygamous, bacon-deprived jerk. I think no bacon is the thing that would really push me over the edge.

I can be a jerk sometimes. Especially on vacation. Maybe you've been one too – probably long, long ago. But I've found that the more I read the red letters, the more I can decode the others. And the more I do that, the kinder I become to you, my travelling companions, and the less jerk-like I become.

Perhaps we'd be better off if we tried less to act religious and tried more to do the red words: *Love one another. Treat others how you want to be treated. Forgive, like, a lot. Don't judge others. And don't worry so much.*

Perhaps the red letters could make us better humans. Perhaps we'd discover that the journey is actually a lot more enjoyable, for us and our travelling companions, as we ride this rock around the Sun together.

If God is Love, Don't Be a Jerk is the title of a book by John Pavlovitz. It's also a pretty good way to summarize the entirety of Jesus' red letters. I've found that this book – and the title – resonate with my experiences.

So, I'd like to begin a conversation around this book. Each chapter comes with four questions to talk about. But I'd rather not make it another church meeting. I'd like it to be a casual, home experience. So on that note, I'd like to invite you to my home to discuss the first couple of chapters. We'll have some snacks; feel free to bring your own drinks. Wine is ok with me, but, well, as the book says, I trust you to not "be a jerk." After that, you can volunteer to host the next couple of chapters at your place. I think doing this about once a month could be enjoyable.
