

Old Testament Reading Psalm 118:1-7, 21-24, 29

Give thanks to the Eternal who is always good, who never ceases to be loving and kind. (תַּסְהַ "hesed")

Let the people of Israel proclaim:

"God never ceases to be loving and kind."(תַסְדַ "hesed")

Let the priests of Aaron's line proclaim:

"God never ceases to be loving and kind." (זְּחָה "hesed")

Let the people who fear the Eternal proclaim:

"God never ceases to be loving and kind." (חַסָּדַ *"hesed"*)

When trouble surrounded me, I cried out to the Eternal; who answered me and brought me to a wide, open space. The Eternal is with me, so I will not be afraid of anything. If God is on my side, how can anyone hurt me? The Eternal is on my side, a champion for my cause; so when I look at those who hate me, victory will be in sight.

I will praise You because You answered me when I was in trouble. You have become my salvation. The stone that the builders rejected has become the very stone that holds together the entire foundation. This is the work of the Eternal, and it is marvelous in our eyes. This is the day the Eternal God has made; let us celebrate and be happy today.

Gospel Reading Matthew 21:33-46

Jesus said, to the chief priests and elders,

"Here is another story:

A landowner planted a vineyard, put a wall around it, fitted it with a winepress, and built a watchtower. Then he rented the vineyard and left town. When harvest time came, the landowner sent his servants to collect rent—in the form of grapes—from his tenants. The tenants attacked these rent-collecting servants. They killed one, stoned another, and beat a third. The dismayed landowner sent another band of servants to try to collect his due, a larger group of servants this time, but the tenants did the same thing—capturing, beating, killing.

Finally the landowner sent his son to the tenants, thinking, 'They will at least respect my son.'

But the tenants knew the son was the best way to get to the landowner, so when they saw the son approaching, they said, 'This is the landowner's heir apparent! Let's kill him and take his inheritance.' And so they did; they threw him out of the vineyard and killed him.

What do you think the landowner will do when he comes and sees those tenants?"

The chief priests and elders said, "He will destroy them, to be sure! Then he will rent the vineyard to other tenants who will pay him at harvesttime."

Jesus responded, "I wonder if any of you has ever opened your Psalms and read: "The stone that the builders rejected has become the very stone that holds together the entire foundation. This is the work of the Eternal One, and it is marvelous in our eyes."

"Therefore, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to people who will tend its sweet fruit and who will give the Creator what is rightly due."
