## First Reading 1 Thessalonians 2:9-13 (The Inclusive Bible)

Let us remind you, sisters and brothers, of our toil and hardship; we worked night and day in order not to be a burden to anyone while we preached the Good News of God to you. You are witnesses, and so is God, that our treatment of you since you have become believers has been just, upright and impeccable. You likewise know how we treated every one of you, as parents do their children - encouraging, comforting and urging you to live lives worthy of God, who calls you into glory and the realm of God. And we constantly thank God for the way you received the words we preached to you, not as our word but as the word of God, which it really was. And it changed your lives when you believed it.

## Second Reading Matthew 23: 1-15, 23-33 (The Inclusive Bible)

Jesus told the crowds and the disciples, "The religious scholars and the Pharisees have succeeded Moses as teachers; therefore, perform every observance they tell you to. But don't follow their example; even they don't do what they say. They tie up heavy loads and lay them on others' shoulders, while they themselves will not lift a finger to help alleviate the burden.

"All their works are performed to be seen. They widen their phylacteries and wear huge tassels. They are fond of places of honor at banquets and the front seats in synagogues. They love respectful greetings in public and being called 'Rabbi.' But as for you, avoid the title 'Rabbi.' For you have only one Teacher, and you are all sisters and brothers. And don't call anyone on earth your 'Mother' or 'Father.' You have only one Parent—our loving God in heaven. Avoid being called leaders. You have only one leader—the Messiah.

"The greatest among you will be the one who serves the rest. Those who exalt themselves will be humbled, but those who humble themselves will be exalted."

"Woe to you religious scholars and Pharisees, you frauds! You shut the doors of heaven's realm in people's faces, neither entering yourselves, nor allowing others to enter who want to. Woe to you religious scholars and Pharisees, you frauds! You go on and on with prayer for show, all the while devouring the only security that widows have—their houses; you, therefore, will be given the greater punishment. Woe to you religious scholars and Pharisees, you frauds! You travel over land and over sea to make a single convert, and once that person is converted, you create a proselyte twice as wicked as yourselves. Woe to you religious scholars and you Pharisees, you frauds! You pay your tithes on mint, dill and cumin while neglecting the weightier matters of the Law—justice, mercy and faithfulness!

#### **Second Reading (continued)**

These you should have practiced, without neglecting the others. You blind guides! You strain out gnats, but swallow camels in the process! Woe to you religious scholars and Pharisees, you frauds! You clean the outside of the cup and the dish, leaving the inside filled with plunder and lust. Blind Pharisees! First clean the inside of the cup so that the outside may become clean as well. Woe to you religious scholars and Pharisees, you frauds! You are like whitewashed tombs, beautiful to look at on the outside, but on the inside full of filth and the bones of the dead. In the same way you present a holy exterior to others, but on the inside you are full of hypocrisy and wickedness. Woe to you religious scholars and Pharisees, you frauds! You build tombs for the prophets and decorate monuments of holy people, saying, 'We never would have joined in shedding the blood of the prophets, had we lived in our ancestors' days.' Ha! Your own evidence testifies against you! You are the descendants of those who murdered the prophets! Now it's your turn: finish what your ancestors started."

# **Continuing Testament** – From *Saving Jesus from the Church*, by Robin R. Meyers 132, 139

In many American churches, Jesus still comes "as one unknown"—or perhaps as one so well-known as to be unrecognizable. He was penniless and itinerant, yet his gospel is now attached to some of the richest and most powerful people on earth, and the good news is really bad news for the poor. Captives are not released; they are warehoused. The blind do not see; rather, the sighted wear blinders. The oppressed are not liberated; they have become the new scapegoats. Sermons are no longer dangerous; they are simply adapted to the appetites and anxieties of the audience. Conservatives rail against sins of the flesh, as if to exorcise their own demons, and liberals baptize political correctness at the expense of honesty...

It was Martin Luther King Jr. who recognized the difference between comforting the poor and confronting the people and systems that cause poverty. Of course, we should be good Samaritans, but we should also consider doing something to make the road to Jericho less dangerous for everyone. In the end, Dr. King knew that "you cannot set the captive free if you are not willing to confront those who hold the keys. Without confrontation compassion becomes merely commiseration, fruitless and sentimental."
