Readings

First Reading Ephesians 1:11-19 (The Message Translation)

It's in Christ that we find out who we are and what we are living for. Long before we first heard of Christ and got our hopes up, he had his eye on us, had designs on us for glorious living, part of the overall purpose he is working out in everything and everyone.

It's in Christ that you, once you heard the truth and believed it (this Message of your salvation), found yourselves home free—signed, sealed, and delivered by the Holy Spirit. This signet from God is the first installment on what's coming, a reminder that we'll get everything God has planned for us, a praising and glorious life.

That's why, when I heard of the solid trust you have in the Master Jesus and your outpouring of love to all the followers of Jesus, I couldn't stop thanking God for you—every time I prayed, I'd think of you and give thanks. But I do more than thank. I ask—ask the God of our Master, Jesus Christ, the God of glory—to make you intelligent and discerning in knowing him personally, your eyes focused and clear, so that you can see exactly what it is he is calling you to do, grasp the immensity of this glorious way of life he has for his followers, oh, the utter extravagance of his work in us who trust him—endless energy, boundless strength!

Second Reading Mark 13:24-37 (The Voice Translation)

Jesus said, be alert, and remember how I have warned you. As Isaiah said in the days after that great suffering, "The sun will refuse to shine, and the moon will hold back its light. The stars in heaven will fall, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken."

Then you will see (as Daniel predicted) "the 'Descendent of Earth' coming in the clouds," clothed in power and majesty, who will send out heavenly messengers and gather together all the chosen from the four corners of the world, from every direction and every land.

Learn this lesson from the fig tree: When its branch is new and tender and begins to put forth leaves, you know that summer must be near. In the same way, when you see *and hear* the things I've described to you taking place, you'll know the time is drawing near.

It's true—this generation will not pass away before all these things have happened. Heaven and earth may pass away, but these words of mine will never pass away.

Take heed: no one knows the day or hour when the end is coming. The messengers in heaven don't know, nor does the Son. Only Abba God knows. So be alert. Watch for it and pray, for you never know when that time might approach.

Second Reading (continued)

This situation is like someone who went on a journey; they departed, leaving servants in charge of the house. Each of them had their own job to do; the porter stood at the door, watching. So stay awake, because no one knows when the owner of the house is coming back. It could be in the evening or at midnight or when the rooster crows or in the morning. *Stay awake;* be alert so that upon returning, the master won't find you sleeping.

Continuing Testament - From The Book of Hours, by Rainer Maria Rilke

Book I, Poem 45

You come and go. The doors swing closed ever more gently, almost without a shudder. Of all who move through the quiet houses, you are the quietest.

We become so accustomed to you,
we no longer look up
when your shadow falls over the book we are reading
and makes it glow. For all things
sing you: at times
we just hear them more clearly.

Often when I imagine you your wholeness cascades into many shapes. You run like a herd of luminous deer and I am dark. I am a forest.

You are a wheel at which I stand, whose dark spokes sometimes catch me up, revolve me nearer to the center.

Then all the work I put my hand to widens from turn to turn.
