

#### Readings

## First Reading Psalm 62 (The Inclusive Language translation)

In God alone my soul finds rest, for my deliverance comes from God, who alone is my rock, my salvation, my fortress: I will never be shaken.

How long will you besiege me as though I were a crumbling wall or a tottering fence? They connive to push me off a cliff; they delight in telling lies. With their mouths they utter blessing, but in their hearts they curse.

In God alone my soul finds rest, for my deliverance comes from God, who alone is my rock, my salvation, my fortress: I will never be shaken. Only in God—my deliverance, my glory— my refuge is God. Trust in God always, my people; pour out your hearts before God our refuge.

Humankind is but a breath, mortals are just an illusion. Put them on the scales and the balance is thrown off: they weigh less than a breath.

## Gospel Reading Mark 1:14-20 (The Inclusive Language translation)

After John's arrest, Jesus appeared in Galilee proclaiming the Good News of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The reign of God is at hand! Change your hearts and minds, and believe this Good News!"

While walking by the Sea of Galilee, Jesus saw the brothers Simon and Andrew casting their nets into the sea, since they fished by trade. Jesus said to them, "Follow me; I will make you fishers of humankind." They immediately abandoned their nets and followed Jesus.

Proceeding a little further along, Jesus saw the brothers James and John Bar-Zebedee. They too were in their boat, putting their nets in order. Immediately Jesus called them, and they left their father Zebedee standing in the boat with the hired help and walked with Jesus.

#### Readings

#### **Continuing Testament** – By Ted A. Smith

In calling the Galilean fishermen to discipleship, Jesus does not just ask them to add one more task to their busy lives. He calls them into new ways of being. When Simon and Andrew leave their nets, they leave a way of life. This is even clearer with James and John, who leave not only their nets but also their father. These disciples leave behind a whole matrix of work, family, and place – all the stuff of a new identity.

The best translation of verse 17 will reflect this new identity. The NRSV had Jesus say, "Follow me and I will make you fish for people." This makes it sound as if fishing for people were a *task*. The better translation receives fishing for people as a new *identity*. A literal translation might read, "Follow me and I will make you to become fishers for people."

There is a world of difference between "I will make you fish" and "I will make you to become fishers." "I will make you fish" gives us one more activity to work into our datebooks. (Right, Jesus, fish for people. How about every fourth Monday? Can anyone else do fourth Mondays?") But "I will make you to become fishers"? That promises a whole new life.
