### First Reading Psalm 62 (Psalms Anew translation)

#### **Gospel Reading**

John 3:14-17, 19-21 (Adapted from The Message translation)

In the same way that Moses lifted the serpent in the desert so people could have something to see and then believe, it is necessary for the Holy One to be lifted up - and everyone who looks up to him, trusting and expectant, will gain a real life, eternal life.

This is how much God loved the world: God sent the Son, so that no one need be destroyed; by believing in the Son, all can have a whole and lasting life. God didn't go to all the trouble of sending the Son merely to point an accusing finger, telling the world how bad it was. The Messiah came to save, to put the world right again.

This is the crisis we're in: God-light streamed into the world, but people everywhere ran for the darkness. They went for the darkness because they were not really interested in pleasing God. Everyone who makes a practice of doing evil, addicted to denial and illusion, hates God-light and won't come near it, fearing a painful exposure. But anyone working and living in truth and reality welcomes God-light so the work can be seen for the God-work it is.
