

Readings

First Reading Acts 4:32-337 (NRSV translation)

Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. With great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. There was not a needy person among them, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold. They laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need. There was a Levite, a native of Cyprus, Joseph, to whom the apostles gave the name Barnabas (which means "son of encouragement"). He sold a field that belonged to him, then brought the money, and laid it at the apostles' feet.

Gospel Reading John 20:19-31 (The Voice Translation)

Mary Magdalene went directly from the tomb to Jesus's disciples. She exclaimed, "I have seen the Lord!" Then she told them everything Jesus said to her.

On that same evening of Resurrection Sunday, the disciples gathered together behind locked doors in fear that some of the Jewish leaders in Jerusalem were still searching for them. Out of nowhere, Jesus appeared in the center of the room.

Jesus said, "Peace."

As He was speaking, He revealed the wounds in His hands and side. The disciples began to celebrate as it sank in that they were really seeing the Lord. Jesus said again, "Peace. In the same way Abba God sent Me, I am now sending you.

Now Jesus drew so close to each of them that they could feel His breath. Jesus breathed on them and said, "Welcome the Spirit of the living God. You now have the mantle of God's forgiveness. As you go, you can share this life-giving power to forgive sins."

Gospel Reading (continued)

Now, all of the eleven were present with the exception of Thomas. He heard their accounts of their interaction with Jesus. The other disciples told Thomas, "We have seen the Lord!"

But Thomas said, "Until I see His hands, feel the wounds of the nails, and put my hand to His side, I won't believe what you are saying."

Eight days later, they gathered again behind locked doors; and Jesus reappeared. But this time Thomas was with them.

Jesus said, "Peace." Then he approached Thomas. "Reach out and touch Me. See the punctures in My hands; reach out your hand, and put it into My side; leave behind your faithlessness, and believe."

Thomas, filled with emotion, said, "You are the one True God and Lord of my life!"

Jesus answered: "Thomas, you have faith because you have seen Me. Blessed are all those who never see Me and yet they still believe."

Jesus performed other wondrous signs that are not written in this book. These accounts are recorded so that you, too, might believe that Jesus is the Anointed, the Liberating King, the Son of God. Accept the life He came to share.
