



Readings

First Reading Ephesians 5:15-20 (The Message)

Don't waste your time on useless work, mere busywork, the barren pursuits of darkness. Expose these things for the sham they are. It's a scandal when people waste their lives on things they must do in the darkness where no one will see. Rip the cover off those frauds and see how they look in the light of Christ.

Wake up from your sleep, climb out of your coffins; Christ will show you the light!

So watch your step. Use your head. Make the most of every chance you get. These are desperate times!

Don't live carelessly, unthinkingly. Make sure you understand what Christ wants.

Don't drink too much wine. That cheapens your life. Drink the Spirit of God, huge draughts of the Spirit. Sing hymns instead of drinking songs! Sing songs from your heart to Christ. Sing praises over everything, any excuse for a song to God in the name of Jesus Christ.

Gospel Reading John 6:50-59 (NRSV)

"This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

The authorities then disputed among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?"

So Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Messiah and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living God sent me, and I live because of God, so whoever is nourished by me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live forever."

Jesus said these things while he was teaching in the synagogue at Capernaum.

Continuing Testament – By Buzz Aldrin, published in *Guideposts Magazine*, October 1970

For several weeks prior to the scheduled lift-off of Apollo 11 back in July, 1969, the pastor of our church, Dean Woodruff, and I had been struggling to find the right symbol for the first lunar landing. We wanted to express our feeling that what we were doing in this mission transcended electronics and computers and rockets.

I wondered if it might be possible to take communion on the moon, symbolizing the thought that God was revealed there too, as we reached out into the universe. I spoke with Dean about the idea and he was enthusiastic.

What happened there, of course, the whole world knows. The Saturn 5 rocket gave us a rough ride at first, but the rest of the trip was smooth. With only seconds' worth of fuel left, we touched down on the Moon at 3:30 p.m.

Now Neil and I were inside Eagle, while Mike circled in lunar orbit, unseen in the black sky above us. In a little while, Neil would give the signal to step down the ladder onto the powdery surface of the moon. Now was the moment for communion.

So I unstowed the elements in their flight packets. I put them and the scripture reading on the little table in front of the abort guidance-system computer. Then I called back to Houston.

"Houston, this is Eagle. This is the LM Pilot speaking. I would like to request a few moments of silence. I would like to invite each person listening in, wherever and whoever they may be, to contemplate for a moment the events of the past few hours and to give thanks in their own individual way."

For me this meant taking communion. In the radio blackout I opened the little plastic packages which contained bread and wine.

I read John 15:5: "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, and I in them, will bear much fruit; for you can do nothing without me."

I poured the wine into the chalice our church had given me. In the one-sixth gravity of the moon the wine curled slowly and gracefully up the side of the cup. It was interesting to think that the very first liquid ever poured on the moon, and the first food eaten there, were communion elements.

I sensed especially strongly my unity with our church back home, and with the Church everywhere.
