### Readings

### First Reading James 2:1-6, 14-17 (NRSV)

My brothers and sisters, do you with your acts of favoritism really believe in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ? For if a person with gold rings and in fine clothes comes into your assembly, and if a poor person in dirty clothes also comes in, and if you take notice of the one wearing the fine clothes and say, "Have a seat here, please," while to the one who is poor you say, "Stand there," or, "Sit at my feet," have you not made distinctions among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts?

Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom that God has promised to those who love God? But you have dishonored the poor. Is it not the rich who oppress you? Is it not they who drag you into court?

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you?

If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.

# Gospel Reading Mark 7:1–8, 21–23 (God's Word Translation)

The Pharisees and some experts in Moses' Teachings who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus. They saw that some of his disciples were unclean because they ate without washing their hands. (The Pharisees, like all other Jewish people, don't eat unless they have properly washed their hands. They follow the traditions of their ancestors. When they come from the marketplace, they don't eat unless they have washed first. They have been taught to follow many other rules. For example, they must also wash their cups, jars, brass pots, and dinner tables.)

The Pharisees and the experts in Moses' Teachings asked Jesus, "Why don't your disciples follow the traditions taught by our ancestors? They are unclean because they don't wash their hands before they eat!"

### Gospel Reading (continued)

Jesus told them, "Isaiah was right when he prophesied about you hypocrites in Scripture: 'These people honor me with their lips,

but their hearts are far from me.

Their worship of me is pointless,

because their teachings are rules made by humans.'

"You abandon the commandments of God to follow human traditions."

Jesus said to them, "Don't you understand? Don't you know that whatever goes into a person from the outside can't make us unclean? It doesn't go into your thoughts but into your stomach and then into a latrine." (By saying this, Jesus declared all foods acceptable.)

He continued, "It's what comes out of a person that makes them unclean. Evil thoughts, sexual sins, stealing, murder, adultery, greed, wickedness, cheating, shameless lust, envy, cursing, arrogance, and foolishness come from within a person. All these evils come from within and make a person unclean."

### **Continuing Testament**

This text was posted on the BBH Pride Community Facebook page. BBH Pride is a local community group that supports the LGBTQ+ community. The following text was written by a homeowner whose BBH Pride yard sign had been stolen from her property:

"My heart melted. Tonight, as I'm getting my kid ready for bed, our doorbell rings. It's late. It's dark out. I was too busy and scared to answer the door, so I made my husband do it. LOL. He comes back carrying our BBH Pride yard sign. The young man that had stolen it returned it.

He apologized for taking it and promised it would never happen again. His parent came with him. This kid was visibly scared. I know that had to be so scary for him and embarrassing. I'm proud of him for doing this. I'm thankful that his parents are teaching him and holding him accountable. My husband thanked the young man and now it's over. I don't know how the parents learned about what their son did, but somehow, he learned that you can't do stuff like that."
