Pastor's Ponderings.....

Hey, did you know there is an election coming up?

Of course, I'm being silly. It seems this election is all we hear about, talk about or even think about. Which is understandable. For democracy to work, we must stay informed and engaged; above all, VOTE!

And yet, it is stressful. Sometimes, it feels overwhelming. When I get off kilter, it pushes me to step back and rediscover essentials: meditate, stay grounded, remain centered. Pray. Unplug. Breathe. Love.

I was reflecting on this last week, because I've been feeling stressed. There's the emotional fallout from my Dad's death less than a month ago, the inevitable estate work with family, etc. I'm parenting a 16-year-old, which is always an adventure. Then I turn on the news and the stress gets dialed up to eleven. I realized that I was getting out of whack. The remedy? For me, it's about finding time to meditate, pray, choose peace, and reflect on my highest values.

My passion, my life's work – however flawed - has been dedicated to walking the path of discipleship with Jesus. Jesus calls us to make the world a better place. Jesus' way leads us to value certain priorities, such as care for the poor, protection of children, peace, forgiveness, non-violence, honest, integrity, compassion, kindness, forgiveness and reconciliation. This is God's dream for us.

Bono said, "Dream of the kind of world you want to live in! Dream out loud at high volume!" Jesus' dream for the world could be summarized in the Golden Rule, do unto others as you would have them do unto you.

In the month of October I would like to explore this simple theme: "Do Unto Others."

This will be the theme of a six week series, and the idea comes from the dynamic liturgist, Dr. Marcia McFee. She writes:

"Our world seems to be consumed with division – often typified in the colors red and blue. Rather than stay in our monochromatic silos, the Golden Rule in scripture challenges us to engage in conversation and seek to create whatever common good we can with our relatives, friends, and neighbors who we might consider to be on the "other side" politically and ideologically. As we attempt to come together, the idea is not that we are obliterating either one or trying to change each other, but rather we discover the beauty that can be created when we work together to make the world a better place. The "purple space" is where we cultivate kindness, compassion, humility, respect, and love for one another and for the good of all the world, no matter what."

You may want to prepare for this series by reading your Bible ahead in preparation. Here's the plan:

- October 6: "Blue and Red Make Purple: Kindness"
 - read Luke 6: 31-36
- October 13 "The Polarization Within: Compassion"
 - read Isaiah 11: 6-9
- October 20 "Listen More, Speak Less: Humility"
 - read Ephesians 4: 1-6
- October 27 - Rev. Gene McAfee - ***Being Church Together*** - read John 17: 21-23
- November 3 "Living Together on Uncommon Ground"
 - read 1 Corinthians 12: 1-26
- November 10 "Malice Toward None: Love"
 - read Matthew 22: 34-40

I hope that you will join us for this preaching series. My hope is that it will be a healing balm in a difficult time. May it call us to remember our shared humanity, our highest values, to treat others as we would want to be treated. Yes, dream of the kind of world we want to live in.


- Reflection on what the scripture you chose means to you - don't worry about using the passage in its entirety. You may want to select a single thought from it and go from there.
- A Christmas memory that may hold special significance to you
- Something going on in the world and what scripture seems to say in response
- Something you may have heard or read related to the scripture passage that has special meaning for you
- Description of a special family (or church) tradition
- The whole meditation may be written as a prayer.
- Sometimes a poem or the lyrics to a special carol works well.
- Conclude your passage with a one or two sentence prayer.

We are a congregational church. We believe that the **congregation** runs the church. This comes from a beautiful theology: *the people are the church!* In other denominations, the pastor has the final word. Here, the pastor doesn't even get a vote!

The United Church of Christ was formed in 1957. To make a convoluted story simple, five traditions came together to form one church – the UCC. They did not work out all their differences. Heck, they didn't even *want* to. They wanted *unity* and they understood it to be different from *uniformity*. So they came together, while still recognizing the autonomy of each congregation to do things their own way.

Remember the Pilgrims on the Mayflower? Turkey dinners? Cool hats? The Pilgrims crossed the Atlantic in 1620 looking for religious freedom. Eventually, the Pilgrims became the **Congregationalists**.

President John Adams was a Congregationalist. The Brecksville United Church of Christ was a Congregational church when founded in 1816. We voted to join the UCC, but we still maintain our Congregationalist way of doing things.

Our constitution describes what congregationalism looks like here. While the pastor doesn't get a vote in most meetings, "*The Pastor is the spiritual leader of the congregation. The Pastor shall be the supervisor of all staff operations and personnel.*"¹ The pastor has a voice, and makes plenty of decisions about worship etc. But most decisions about church administration and activities come from the congregation. If the furnace breaks, Congregationalists tell the pastor, "Just preach, Rev. We got this." That's fine with me.

The Brecksville United Church of Christ constitution describes how that covenantal process works. So we have meetings, nominations, motions, votes, and other dull but necessary stuff going on behind the scenes of a thriving church. We follow these procedures, not because we live for the process, but because we honor the people with whom we have formed this covenant.

If you would like to serve on a ministry, please talk to me, Bridget Sproul, Sherrill Witt, or anyone on the Stewardship/Leadership Development (SDL) ministry. Let them know how you would like to serve in your church. And ask questions!

SDL will then meet to make sure that we're getting the right mix of talents and ministries, new and old members, and a good distribution across the different ministries.

Then the SDL prepares a slate of candidates nominated to the different ministries. At the end of January we have our annual congregational meeting. That is when the slate of candidates comes up for a congregational vote. Once approved the new batch of leaders can begin, and the old batch can take a break.

For a short while.

Are you ready to serve?

If we want an active and engaging church, we need active and engaged members. We're especially looking at you, newbies! If you are new, getting involved in these ministries is a great way to make a contribution, build relationships and make your voice heard. You bring fresh perspectives and new ideas. We look forward to hearing from you, and discovering the new ideas that you bring.
