#### First Reading Ephesians 4: 1-6, NRSVUE

I, therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace: there is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and [Parent] of all, who is above all and through all and in all.

#### Gospel Reading Mark 10:32-45 (NRSV)

They were on the road, going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was walking ahead of them; they were amazed, and those who followed were afraid. He took the twelve aside again and began to tell them what was to happen to him, saying, "See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Humanity will be handed over to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn him to death; then they will hand him over; they will mock him, and spit upon him, and flog him, and kill him; and after three days he will rise again."

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you."

And he said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you?"

And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory."

But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?"

They replied, "We are able."

#### Gospel Reading (continued)

Then Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared." When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John.

So Jesus called them and said to them, "You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Humanity came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for all."

### Continuing Testament – From *If God Is Love, Don't Be a Jerk,* by John Paylovitz

As a twenty-seven-year pastor, I've spent decades trying to convince other people that I'm absolutely certain of everything in matters of belief while not being completely sure of much of anything.

In the quiet moments, far away from the flattering spotlights of megachurch pulpits, conference platforms, and viral blog posts, I've lived with the persistent voice that says, "You know you don't know what the hell you're doing, right?" (Maybe you recognize that voice?) I used to think that was The Enemy trying to deceive me (a convenient defense mechanism built into my default Christian story for any unpleasant experiences or uncomfortable moments) but now I realize it wasn't a lurking devil but an honest friend, keeping me grounded enough to remember that you don't become an expert in divinity as a human being, any more than you become an authority on the afterlife while you're alive.

As terrifying as it is both personally and vocationally and as much as it makes some people (including myself) uneasy, little by little I'm finally settling into a humility that can admit this vast, continual learning curve.

#### **Continuing Testament** (continued)

I'm growing more comfortable with all that I don't know; with the incomplete thoughts and the unresolved conflicts and the uncomfortable silences of trying to connect with a creator who seems reclusive on some days and downright antagonistic on others.

I suppose this infinite expanse of uncertainty is as good a place as any to start. It's where all authentic spiritual journeys begin: the cavernous gap between the need and the knowing, that messy, not-yet space of wanting more information than you have about the most pressing questions of this life.

You and I are always there (along with every other human being who's ever made their home on this planet), and it's a really freeing thing when you realize the commonality in our shared struggle regardless of our faith tradition or religious worldview. Despite our pedigree or profession or our claims of blessed assurance, none of us really knows what we're doing here. You and I and Mother Teresa and Franklin Graham and the guy on the corner with a bullhorn condemning random pedestrians and the awkward high school student handing you your value meal—we are all working with incomplete information on the infinite, and we could all use a little kindness and a bit of mercy.
