Pastor's Ponderings.....

I write this column one week before the election. There is a palpable sense of anxiety. It seems to cover our nation like a blanket. We find ourselves living in separate realities, consuming isolated silos of information – and misinformation. We're wound pretty tight.

Still, we are neighbors.

I recently received a pamphlet in the mail with instructions to copy it and distribute to the congregation. It presented two columns, one for each presidential candidate, with a side-by-side comparison. It was written to "guide voters on issues that matter to Christians." The issues: banning abortion, protecting gun rights, building a border wall, banning same sex marriage, etc.

If any of these "issues that matter to Christians" mattered to Jesus, he didn't say a thing about any of them.

These are the issues that Jesus actually talked about: "Stop judging so that you will not be judged. (Matthew 7:1) Do to others as you would have them do to you. (Matthew 7:12) Take care of the hungry, the homeless and the stranger. (Matthew 25:37) These are the issues that mattered to Jesus. He called it, The Reign of God. He said it is at hand, in fact, it is within you (Matthew 4:17, Luke 17:21.)

Jesus never told us to love our church. Jesus never told us to love our party, our ideology, or our nation. Jesus told us to love our neighbor. THAT is the mission of the church. So let's make sure that we maintain, in this church, a focus on the mission.

Let's keep our eye on the ball, and not get distracted by every flashy "emergency."

Let's keep this church as a sanctuary, a safe space, a healing space. "A river in a time of dryness, a harbor in the tempest," as the band U2 sings.

Pastor's Ponderings.....

Conflict is inevitable. Peter and Paul argued bitterly (Galatians 2:11-14.) The disciples argued with each other behind Jesus' back (Mark 9:33-35). Conflict happens in nations, and, sadly, churches; that should not surprise us.

That is why we have established processes for handling conflict. Our congregation has a Pastoral Relations Committee. We also have a separate Human Resources Committee, which manages personnel matters common to every workplace. These two groups have recently been established in accordance with best practices as recommended by the UCC. Whenever there is a conflict in the congregation, it is imperative that we utilize these resources. They ensure that every voice is heard, that misunderstandings are clarified, and that our direction is guided by prudent listening, facts, faith, and healthy communication. When there are more serious conflicts, we also enlist the help, mediation and resources of the UCC Living Water Association. This is a good way to strengthen the congregation to be that "harbor in the tempest."

As we navigate changing currents in our church and in our nation, the mission from Jesus remains the same. Love your neighbor. Vote with love. Speak with love. Act with love. Work with love. Gather as a congregation – in love.

Someday, maybe we'll get it all together and become a more perfect union, a more perfect congregation. In the meantime, we are pilgrims on our way, learning, listening patiently to one another, growing, hopefully in the direction of kindness.

As Connie Schultz wrote: "Feet forward; heart wide open."

Breathe. Stay focused on Jesus and his mission: "Love your neighbor."

Gossip

The Bible has several verses that caution against gossip. Here are a few:

- *Proverbs 16:28: "A perverse person stirs up conflict, and a gossip separates close friends."*
- *Proverbs 20:19: "A gossip betrays a confidence; so avoid anyone who talks too much."*
- *James 1:26: "Those who consider themselves religious and yet do not keep a tight rein on their tongues deceive themselves, and their religion is worthless."*
- *Ephesians 4:29: "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen."*
- *2 Corinthians 12:20: "For I am afraid that when I come, I may not find you as I want you to be, and you may not find me as you want me to be. I fear that there may be discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, slander, gossip, arrogance, and disorder."*
- *1 Timothy 5:13: "They get into the habit of being idle and going about from house to house. And not only do they become idlers, but also busybodies who talk nonsense, saying things they ought not to."*

Why does the Bible have so much to say about gossip? I used to think gossip was harmless, petty chit chat. Then I became a pastor and began to see how destructive gossip can be. If not checked, it can divide and destroy congregations.

Rumi said, “Before you speak let your words pass through three gates. Is it true? Is it necessary? Is it kind?”

I wrote that down. I printed it out. I shared it with loved ones. I’m sharing it with you.

Gossip jumps over all three gates. Is it true? Well, who knows, but, you know, people are saying... Is it necessary? Um, heck no, but it’s juicy. Is it kind? Of course not, but who cares? It’s been said that “A lie can travel halfway around the world before the truth can get its boots on.” But in a digital age, gossip speeds along the information superhighway. It destroys lives. It destroys careers, families and yes, churches. Gossip is one of the most pernicious and difficult weeds to pull. It’s easy to see in others; trickier to identify in ourselves. Churches have always been fertile ground for such troubles. Like weeds in a garden, gossip consumes precious resources without producing much that’s worthwhile.

Direct, open, honest communication is the hallmark of a healthy church. Gossip is the surest symptom of a dysfunctional church – or church member. Bottom line: If you have something to say, say it to those who need to hear it. If that’s not safe, communicate with an authority who needs to hear it. Otherwise, heed Grandma’s advice: if you don’t have something nice to say, don’t say anything at all.

Is it true? - Is it necessary? - Is it kind?

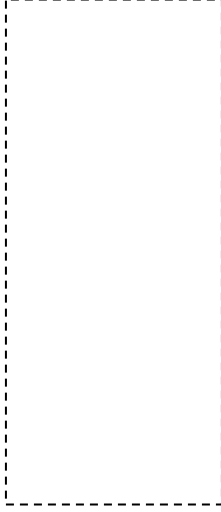
