



One: We have lit the candles symbolizing "Hope" and "Peace." Now we light the candle symbolizing "Joy."

One: Let us, though many, pray in one voice.

All: Gracious and loving God, as we await the coming of the One whom you sent, grant that our waiting might be the active kind. Give us the courage to meet the challenge of altering our thoughts and feelings about the world around us so that our actions might also be changed. Help us to keep our priorities straight, our passions properly pointed, and our eyes fixed upon the prize of joy. Remind us that you lovingly require evidence of our repentance – kindness, justice and compassion. We pray in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen.

Readings

First Reading Philippians 4: 4-9 (God's Word Translation)

Always be joyful in God! I'll say it again: Be joyful! Let everyone know how considerate you are. God is near. Don't worry about anything. But in every situation let God know what you need in prayers and requests while giving thanks. Then God's peace, which goes beyond anything we can imagine, will guard your thoughts and emotions through Christ Jesus.

Finally, brothers and sisters, keep your thoughts on whatever is right or deserves praise: dedicate yourself to things that are true, honorable, fair, pure, acceptable, or commendable. Then the God who gives this peace will be with you.

Gospel Reading Luke 1: 39-56 (NRSV)

In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country,

where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth.

When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit

and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb.

And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me?

For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy.

And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord."

And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord,

and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,

for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed;

for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is God's name.

Whose mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation.

Who has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts.

Who has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly;

Who has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty. Who has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, according to the promise made to our ancestors, to Abraham and Sarah and to their descendants forever."

And Mary remained with her about three months and then returned to her home.

Continuing Testament – by Tia Began, BUCC Advent Devotional

This connection between Mary, the baby in the womb, and Elizabeth shows the sharing of joy and of hope between the women. Mary, chosen by God to carry the Christ-Child, has significance because it is a lesson still being encountered in our lives today. The uncertainty of how life and lifestyle will be changed with the beginnings of another life is daunting. There is no quick fix or clean-click to return to the previous... no matter what the outcome or original wish.

But being chosen, blessed and entrusted with carrying not only a baby, but the king of all people's is a halo that Mary had no expectation of, but accepts with humble gratitude.

Sharing the news at Zechariah's home with Elizabeth helps Mary to confirm the reality of her immaculate role in the Message of God. Elizabeth, with the remark of 'felt the baby kick' is the start of presenting the joyful news to all people.

We are indebted to Mary and the joy she carried for the world to experience.
