LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLE

Rev. John: This evening, we celebrate the birth of Jesus, who came as the Light to a world in darkness. We have prepared for this celebration by throughout the four Sundays of Advent. We have lit the Advent Candle symbolizing HOPE. As night falls, and the shadows grow long, we wait in hopeful expectation for the coming light.

All: (sing) O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, that mourns in lonely exile here until the child of God appear.

Rev. John: We have lit the Advent Candle symbolizing PEACE. As war and violence swirl around us, we watch for the coming Prince of Peace.

All: (sing) O come, desire of Nations, bind all people in one heart and mind. Bid all our sad divisions cease, and fill the world with Heaven's peace.

Rev. John: We have lit the Advent Candle symbolizing JOY. As we struggle amid the shadows and gloom, we drink deeply from the font of all joy.

All: (sing) O come, Key of David come, and open wide your heavenly home; make safe the path to endless day, to death's destruction close the way.

Rev. John: We have lit the Advent Candle symbolizing LOVE. As love seems a rare commodity in our world, we cling to the love that will not let us go.

All: (sing) O come, thou Dayspring, come and cheer our spirits by thine advent here; Love stir within the womb of night, and death's dark shadows put to flight.

Rev. John: Now we light the CHRIST CANDLE. It is a symbol of the Light of Christ which has come into the world. People of God, rejoice, for a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Creator, God of Peace.





# Readings

#### First Reading Isaiah 9:2-7 (NRSV)

- "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness— on them light has shined.
- You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder.
- For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian.
- For all the boots of the tramping warriors and all the garments rolled in blood shall be burned as fuel for the fire.
- For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
- His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom.

#### Gospel Reading Luke 2:1-14 (NRSV)

- In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered.
- This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered.
- Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David.
- He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child.
- While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child.
- And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.
- In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night.
- Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified.
- But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people:
- to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord.
- This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger."

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace!"

**Continuing Testament** – John 1:1-14 (The Voice Translation)

Before time itself was measured, the Voice was speaking.

The Voice was and is God.

This celestial Word remained ever present with the Creator;

This Word shaped the entire cosmos.

Immersed in the practice of creating,

all things that exist were spoken into being.

This breath filled all things

with a living, breathing light—

A light that thrives in the depths of darkness,

blazes through murky bottoms.

It cannot and will not be quenched.

A man named John, who was sent by God, was the first to clearly articulate the source of this Light. This baptizer put in plain words the elusive mystery of the Divine Light so all might believe. Some wondered whether he might be the Light, but John was not the Light. He merely pointed to the Light. The true Light, who shines upon the heart of everyone, was coming into the cosmos.

The Light entered our world; yet the world did not recognize the very Voice of their Maker. Creation did not recognize the Creator, they refused to listen. But for all who did receive and trust, the Voice gave them the right to be reborn as children of God; and bestowed this birthright not by human power or initiative but by God's will.

So the Voice took on flesh and became human and chose to live alongside us. And we have seen Him, Jesus - enveloped in undeniable splendor— one true Child of God, evidenced in the perfect balance of grace and truth.


