#### First Reading Isaiah 40: 1-5 (NRSV)

- Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God.
- Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid...
- A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God.
- Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.
- Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken."
- Gospel Reading Luke 3: 1-6 (NRSV)In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene,
- during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness.


