Readings

First Reading Isaiah 43:1-7 (The Voice Translation)

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah:

Remember who created you, O Jacob?

Who shaped you, O Israel?

See, you have nothing to fear. I, who made you, will take you back.

I have chosen you, named you as My own.

When you face stormy seas I will be there with you with endurance and calm;

you will not be engulfed in raging rivers.

If it seems like you're walking through fire with flames licking at your limbs, keep going; you won't be burned.

Because I, the Eternal One, am your God.

I am the Holy One of Israel, and I will save you.

I have traded in nations to win you back,

Egypt, Cush, and Seba, in exchange for your freedom.

Because you are special to Me and I love you,

I gladly give up other peoples in exchange for you;

They are trivial by comparison to your weighty significance.

So don't be afraid. I am here.

I will reunite you with your children,

bringing them back from wherever in the world they are—East, West, North, or South.

No place will be able to hold you when I demand your release, when I order them.

Gospel Reading Luke 3:15-23 (God's Word Translation)

People's hopes were rising as they all wondered whether John was the Messiah.

John replied to all of them, "I baptize you with water. But the one who is more powerful than I is coming. I am not worthy to until his sandal straps. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.

- His winnowing shovel is in his hand to clean up his threshing floor. He will gather the wheat into his barn, but he will burn the husks in a fire that can never be put out."
- With many other encouraging words, he told the Good News to the people.
- John spoke out against the ruler Herod because Herod had married his own sister-in-law, Herodias. He also spoke out against Herod for all the evil things he had done.
- So Herod added one more evil to all the others; he locked John in prison. When all the people were baptized, Jesus, too, was baptized. While he was praying, heaven opened,
- and the Holy Spirit came down to him in the form of a dove. A voice from heaven said, "You are my Son, whom I love. I am pleased with you." Jesus was about 30 years old when he began his ministry.

Continuing Testament – by Richard Rohr

After fourteen years as a chaplain in the Albuquerque jails, I am convinced that the reason people make great mistakes is because they have never heard what Jesus heard on the day of his baptism. They never heard another human voice, much less a voice from heaven, say to them, "You are a beloved son. You are a beloved daughter and in you I am well pleased." If we've never had anyone believe in us, take delight in us, affirm us, call us beloved, we don't have anywhere to begin. There's nothing exciting and wonderful to start with, so we spend our whole lives trying to say those words to ourselves: "I'm okay, I'm wonderful, I'm great." But we don't really believe it. The word has to come from someone greater than us. That's really a parent's primary job—to communicate to their child that they are a beloved, eternally-existing child of God. Our jails are filled to over-flowing with people who never heard this foundational message—and sadly, so is much of our world.

The only purpose of the gospel, and even religion, is to communicate that one and eternal truth. Once we have that straight, nothing can stop us and no one can take it away from us, because it is given only, always, and everywhere by God—for those who will accept it freely. My only job and any preacher's job is to try to replicate and resound that

eternal message of God that initiates everything good on this earth— You are beloved children of God!
