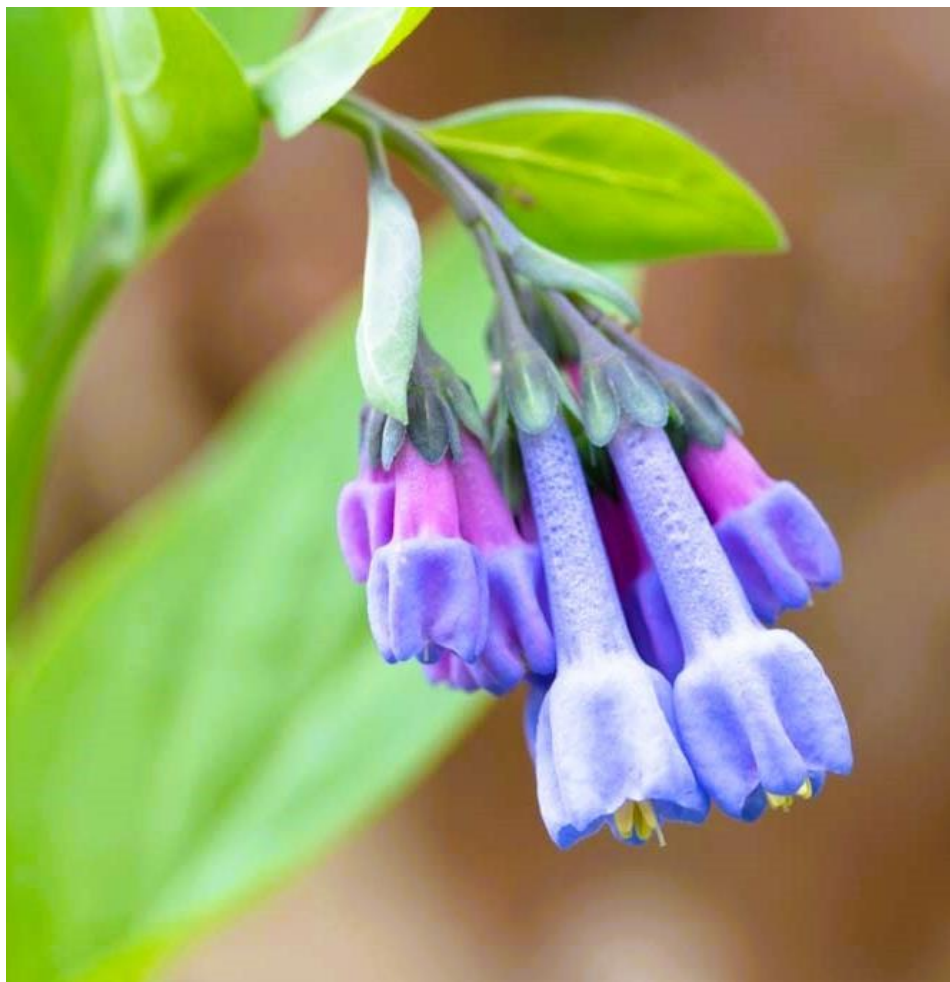

Pastor's Ponderings.....

I'm really not a nosy neighbor. Usually.

My writing space includes a nice view of the yard. But as I write there, I can also see the front porch of my neighbor, Beth. She's up in years, and sometimes struggles to walk.

I looked up from my keyboard and saw Janet step out on the porch. She stood in the drizzle and stared above. She clutched herself and a sob escaped.

An hour later, more cars than usual congregated in the driveway. Then there was only one car left. It belonged to Janet. Something had happened.



I think it's fair to say that Janet and I disagree wildly on a great deal religiously and politically.

Around election season Janet and Beth supported their candidates with yard signs. I supported the opposing candidates with my yard signs too. One sign was on a very narrow patch of grass by the driveway. Her sign was so close it blocked the view of my sign. I put my sign up on stilts so drivers could see both. We got a bit silly.

Still, I sometimes helped with Beth's trash and always cleared the snow from her walkway.

My wife, Katie sent a Christmas card with a note, "I think we disagree on politics, but I think we agree on how to be good neighbors."

On Christmas Eve, the doorbell rang. There was Janet at our door holding a poinsettia. She expressed regret about the sign kerfuffle. She said how much she appreciated Katie's Christmas Card. Katie and I were both touched by Janet's thoughtfulness and kindness. I took her poinsettia to church to decorate our sanctuary on Christmas Eve.



But now, I had just observed her crying on the porch. The next day, I walked over and knocked on the door.

“Hi Janet, I couldn’t help but notice the other day, because my writing desk faces east, but I saw you cry, and I just wanted to let you know I cared about you, and I care about Beth, and if there’s anything I can do to give you a hand or something, maybe just go to the store, or whatever. I’m here for you. Let me know if I can help.”

Her heart was full of grace. She said that her mother, Beth, had fallen and broken her hip. She was in so much pain, and she didn’t know what to do and thought she really needed to go to the hospital. I assured her she was in my prayers, and I would be there for her if I could.

Later, Beth had hip replacement surgery and was recovering in a nursing facility.

On Easter afternoon, I took this photograph of a magnolia tree. Years ago, Beth told me it was an anniversary gift from her late husband, and when it bloomed, it reminded Beth of him. On Easter, I texted the photo to Beth, and it meant so much to her. As the days went by, I texted more photos of her spring blossoms.

Yes, we disagree on much. We could choose to focus on that. Perhaps we will someday. But we can always choose to show compassion. I think Jesus prefers that to arguing or stonewalling. The choice is always ours.

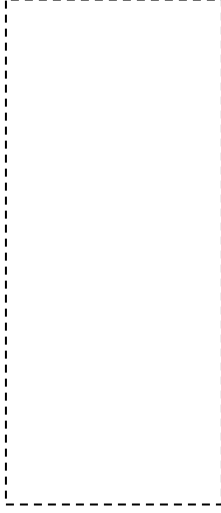
