First Reading Hebrews 11:1-3

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.

Gospel Reading Luke 12:32-40

"Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit;

Continuing Testament from The New Century Hymnal Companion

(The African American hymn "Hush, Hush, Somebody's Calling My Name") sounds like a lullaby. The opening stanza presents an image of a person aware of the approach of death yet wishing to hide from it. However, the tone moves from one of dread to one of rejoicing when it is discovered that Jesus is the one who is calling. Many African American spirituals do not picture death as disagreeable; instead they associate death with reward, deliverance, and the final step toward freedom. Often in spiritual songs about death, reunion with loved ones who have gone before is eagerly anticipated. This African American tune was arranged for The New Century Hymnal by Jeffrey Radford... who served on the hymnal committee. Radford arranged eight African American spirituals for the hymnal, most of them in gospel style. Jeffrey Radford has provided a gentle, rocking arrangement for this syncopated melody, filling in the pauses between words with rhythmic patterns and "hallelujahs." To perform this song quickly would not do justice to its quiet intensity.
